Women's streak snapped at ASU

The Oregon women's basketball team had its four-game winning streak snapped Saturday in a 81-68 loss to Arizona State in Tempe.

Karen O'Connor led Arizona State with 18 points as the Sun Devils improved to 3-6 in the Pac-10, 11-8 overall. Oregon

dropped to 6-3 in conference play, 14-6 overall.

Oregon had a miserable second half, shooting a sub-pathetic 18 percent from the field as the Sun Devils took off from a one-point halftime lead to the 13-point difference at the end.

Arizona State led 63-49 with 10:04 left in the game, but the Ducks drew to within six at 70-64 with 1:39 left. The Sun Devils made six of eight free throws down the stretch to pull away for the win.

Senior center Stefanie Kasperski exemplified the Oregon effort, making just three of 13 shots from the field on the way to 12 points. Trina McCartney had 20 points, but was just four-for-11 from the field.

For the game, Oregon hit just 18 of 55 shots from the field for a 32.7 shooting percentage.

Vidlak leads matmen over PSU

The Oregon wrestling team ran its season record to 9-1 over the weekend with a 22-13 win over Portland State Friday in McArthur Court and an easy 33-5 win over Southern Oregon State in Ashland.

Dan Vidlak started things off for Oregon with an overwhelming 25-7 win over Portland State's Ariah Fasana. Fasana got the takedown to open the match, but it was all Vidlak after that as the 118-pounder grabbed a 6-2 lead after one period, led 14-5 after two and cruised on to the win.

The Vikings came back in the 126-pound match with Broderick Lee grabbing a tough 6-2 decision over Oregon's Rob Stone. Lee got a takedown and a nearfall in the first period to take a 5-0 lead. Lee extended the lead to 6-0 in the second period and held on for the win.

Jason Pehling, a 134-pound wrestler, extended Oregon's lead in the meet to 8-3 with an 8-4 win over Portland State's Allen Rollins. Pehling led 7-3 going into the match's third and final period and held Rollins to an escape to take the win.

Viking James Sisson continued the match's see-saw act with 8-0 shutout decision over

Pat Craig in the 142-pound division. The win drew Portland State to within one at 8-7.

In the 150-pound division, Oregon's George Johnston took a tough 2-1 win, over Joey Herrera to give the Ducks an 11-7 lead. Johnston got a point in the first period for a stalling call on Herrera and another in the second for an escape to make it 2-0. Herrera got an escape in the third period to account for the final score.

Oregon extended its lead to 14-7 as 158-pounder Darren Gustafson decided Pat Utter of Portland State 10-4. Gustafson led 7-2 after one period and held on for the win.

Dan Russell of Portland State decided Eric Messner 4-2 in the 167-pound match to pull the Vikings within 14-10 with just three matches remaining.

Curt Strahm took a dominating decision over Damion Triplett of Portland State by a 19-6 score to put Oregon ahead 18-10. Curt Strahm led 1-0 after one period, 8-2 after two and scored 11 points to cruise to the win.

Tony Champion of Portland State took the Vikings' last win of the meet, a 5-4 decision over Joe Rissone at the 190-pound division. Champion was award-

ed a point in the third period for the win.

Cam Strahm took a 12-3 win over John Paul Jones of Portland State in the heavyweight match to round out the meet.

Oregon won all but one of its matches against Southern Oregon on the way to the dominating win. Southern Oregon's only win came at 158 pounds where Jeff Marshall decided Darren Gustafson 4-0.


