Food and Fitness Issues for the College Student is the title of a workshop to be held tonight at 8 in EMU Cedar Room C. Minority students are encouraged to attend.



The College of Arts and Sciences will honor 15 of its graduates with the second Dean's Alumni Achievement Awards during the college's annual recognition dinner and dance Saturday.

Russell Tomlin, associate professor of linguistics and acting head of the department of East Asian Languages and Literatures, will receive the 1990 Dean's Development Award for his efforts in improving language study at the University

Eight of the 15 alumni recipients are expected to attend the by-invitation-only ceremony on campus to receive their awards in person. They are: Walter Babcock, chief executive officer of Bend Research, Inc.; Richard Bray, a native Eugenian, executive vice president of Standard Oil; Charles Delzell, cited as "perhaps the leading American scholar of 20th-century Italian history"; Thelma Greenfield, recognized as one of the most distinguished Renaissance scholars of her generation; John Hunt, a leader in high-power laser research; Larry Large, vice chancellor for public affairs for the Oregon State System of Higher Education; Colleen McCloud, senior vice president and creative media director for the Los Angeles office of the advertising agency Foote, Cone and Belding Communications, Inc.; and David Moursund, professor of the International Society for technology in Education.
