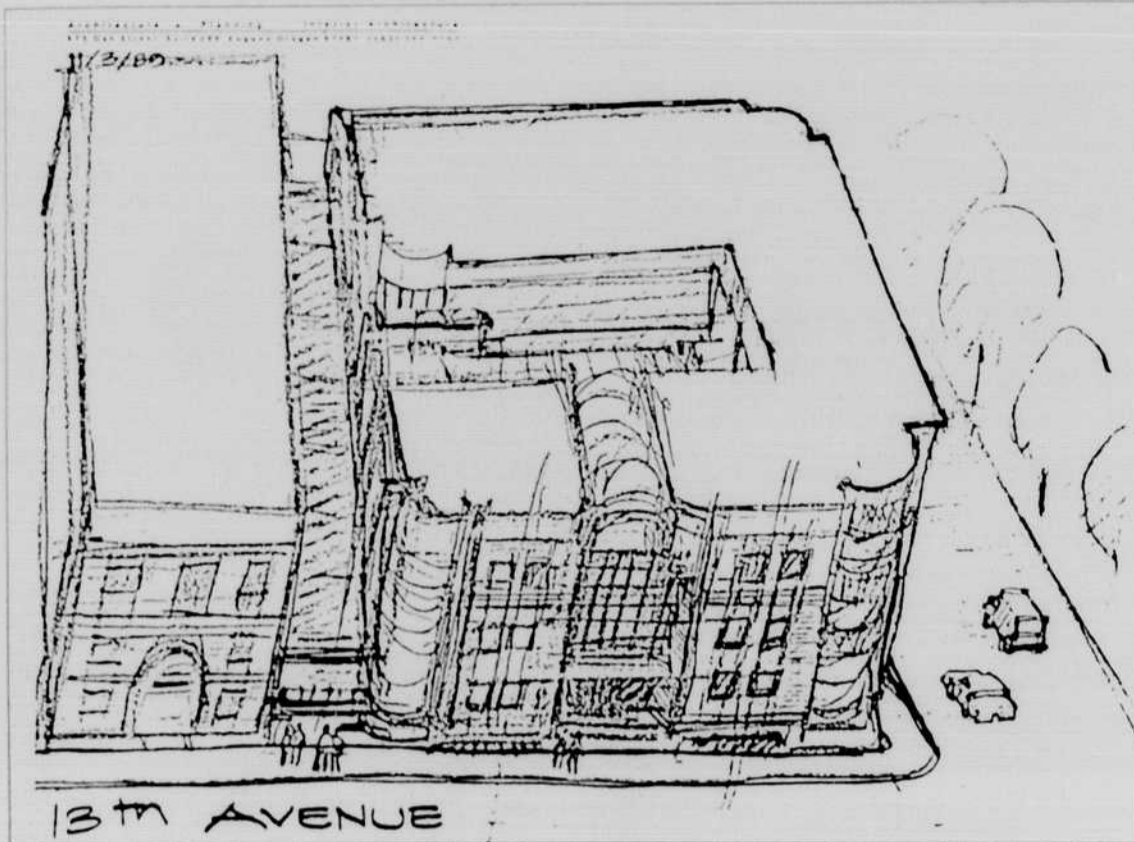

unique to the site, Weber said. The University Group's reasons for requesting a variance, such as the large student population, apply throughout the West University neighborhood, not just to the site on High

Street, Weber said. The University Group has 10 days to appeal the administrative decision issued by building and permit services Feb 2.

The University Group could also petition the city planning department to change the land use code city-wide so that fewer parking spaces are required for each dwelling unit, Weber said.

Paz said he would meet with Ford and Segal to decide what action to take.

Meanwhile, Mobley is waiting to hear from Ford and Segal.

Mobley declined to give the details of his lease agreement with The University Group.

Neither Ford nor Segal could be reached for comment Monday.

closed that chemical dumping occurred in several areas during the late 1960s and early '70s.

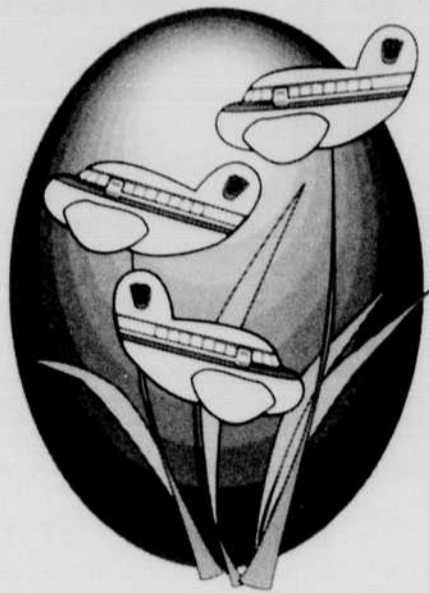
The purpose of the environmental assessment is to determine what chemicals and other waste materials may remain on or below the surface. University officials are concerned that hazardous materials were dumped on the property before state and federal laws regulating waste disposal were enacted.

For about four days, workers will bore holes and install eight monitoring wells in the area between the railroad tracks that cross the property and the south bank of the Willamette River.

Workers are also expected to spend two days drilling numerous holes to take samples of soil from the storage yard at the west end of the site. The samples will be tested for PCBs and for the wood preservatives creosote and pentachlorophenol.

The University expects to receive preliminary findings by mid-March, and will release the results sometime this summer.
