MEASLES VACCINE NOT JUST FOR KIDS

Did you know...

- "Vaccine failure" among college-age persons and young people account for 50% of measles cases
- The measles outbreak this last year was the worst since 1980
- The death toll for measles is the highest in 18 years
- The measles outbreak in Medford and Ashland last spring included student teachers from Southern Oregon State College

The measles "shot" you got as a child isn't enough!

According to the Oregon Department of Health, college students in Oregon should obtain a second dose of measles vaccine. (Students born before 1957 would be exempt from this recommendation).

Measles vaccine is available at the Student Health Center for approximately \$22.00.

YWCA budget proposal refused

The Incidental Fee Committee refused to accept the budget proposal of the YWCA in a 2-1 vote at Tuesday's meeting.

IFC members Armando Morales, Paul Nhem and Steve Maples were in attendance.

The YWCA requested an increase in the

budget for speakers from \$200 to \$500 and an increase in workshop budget from \$100 to \$150.

YWCA Director Jesse Fortier told IFC members that the program has made substantial improvements in the past few years and needs the additional money to expand the program.

In January, the YWCA sponsored a racial justice workshop. Fortier said she was pleased with the success of the workshop and she hopes the YWCA can continue sponsoring similar workshops.

"I feel like the last time I came into IFC, I didn't look very good," Fortier said. "At that time, I was trying to pick the program up off the ground."

The YWCA recently sent two members to a national conference. Fortier said the YWCA

wants to put together what they learned and bring it to the University.

"We want to develop some programs and workshops on campus to make people aware of what racism is," YWCA member Marcy Middleton said. "We are committed to working with the YWCA to fight racism on campus."

YWCA assistant director Rebecca Ambrose also suggested that more money be allocated to the budget for advertising purposes.

The ASUO recommended that the YWCA not receive a budget increase and eliminate the position of assistant director.

"So far this program does not have a very strong record of year to year consistency," said Tracy Naber, ASUO finance coordinator.

Maples and Nhem turned down the proposal.

Nhem said additional money should be removed from staff positions and allocated for speakers and workshops.

The YWCA will file a formal appeal in order to have their budget reviewed again at the end of the budget season.

Out of several student groups on the agenda, YWCA was the only group to attend Tuesday's meeting.

"I am disappointed to see only YWCA attend the meeting," Nhem said. "In the future, student groups should be sure to check their mailboxes for their hearing dates."
