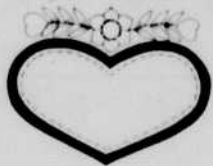

Beavers beat Ducks once again

Someday, someplace, Oregon will beat Oregon State in a Pacific-10 Conference basketball game.

Maybe it will happen after Gary Payton leaves Corvallis. Maybe it will happen as the Ducks put the 1980s behind them and move on to the future.

Granted, Oregon won at Gill Coliseum in 1986 and in McArthur Court in 1988, but on Sunday, the Beavers pulled off another squeaker, 57-55, in Gill Coliseum to beat Oregon for the third time this season and their 24th win in the last 26 meetings between the two schools.

The Ducks have now been beaten by three, two and two points, respectively, in their meetings with Oregon State this year.

"This is as close as we can get," Oregon guard Kevin Mixon said. "What can you do? Yes, I think we are snakebitten."

"We have proven three different times it's not a fluke that we can beat Oregon State," Duck center Richard Lucas said. "We're in the same gym that they destroyed two teams last week (a 98-81 win over California and an 84-70 victory against Stanford). They realized we can beat them."

For the third time this season, Payton scored 30 points against the Ducks, but Oregon hung in against the Beavers and a sell-out crowd of 10,400 to battle back the entire game, coming back time and again — from an 11-point deficit in the first half, a 33-27 difference at halftime and a 56-49 mark with just over one minute remaining.

Oregon had a chance to send the game into overtime, but like so many other Civil War games, the Ducks just couldn't get a break when they needed it most.

With just 12 seconds left, Payton was at the free throw line to shoot a one-and-one
