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were shelled," Eberhart said. "Now we have 12, 13 guys who could pitch so if someone gets hit hard we can bring someone else in."

The Ducks will also benefit from an earlier start this year, as they open the season on Feb. 22 with a home doubleheader against Western Baptist at Eugene's Civic Stadium.

In the past Oregon usually played its first game in March, a month after most of their NAIA rivals, which compose the bulk of the Duck season. Both coaches see the early start as a blessing.

"It's very important that we're starting off early," Eberhart said, "and hopefully it will help Marc and I decide some things such as who will start and who will be seeing some action."

"We're starting as early as anyone we play," Distefano added. "That will help us because we need to get more work outside."

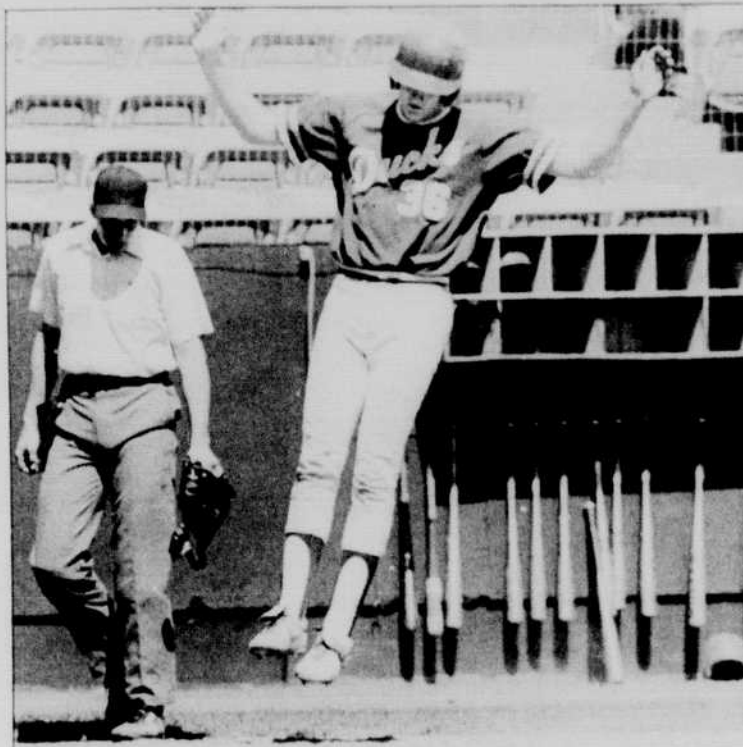
If there is one concern Distefano and Eberhart have, it's with the outfield. The Ducks return several good players such as Will Bracy and Jeff Sternoff, but who will actually start in the outfield is still pretty much up in the air.

"Who plays in the outfield will remain to be seen," Eberhart said. "The outfield has never really played together before."

"I pretty much have confidence in everybody's ability," Distefano said. "But we have a lot of new guys out there who haven't played together before."

Both Bracy and Sternoff will be competing for a spot in the outfield along with Ferris, Ginsberg and newcomer Mark Orndoff. Chris Conway, who played last season, should also get plenty of action in the outfield.

Although recognition is something that has come slowly for the team, Distefano feels that the word is out on the

quality of the team's play, as evident by the recent tryouts.

"People realize we have a decent team," he said. "It makes us feel like we've accomplished something."

After opening with Western Baptist, the Ducks play two doubleheaders with Pacific and then play three more road games before heading to California over spring vacation to play five games, including a twinbill with NCAA Division II Cal State-Hayward and a single game with Sonoma State, another Division II school.

Distefano and Eberhart see Linfield and George Fox as the toughest teams on the schedule, as well as junior varsity teams from Oregon State and Portland State, but Distefano said he isn't worried as Oregon has one of the most competitive teams in the Northwest outside of the Pac-10.

"Most teams we play respect us," he said. "We give everyone we play a good ballgame and the players and coaches respect us."

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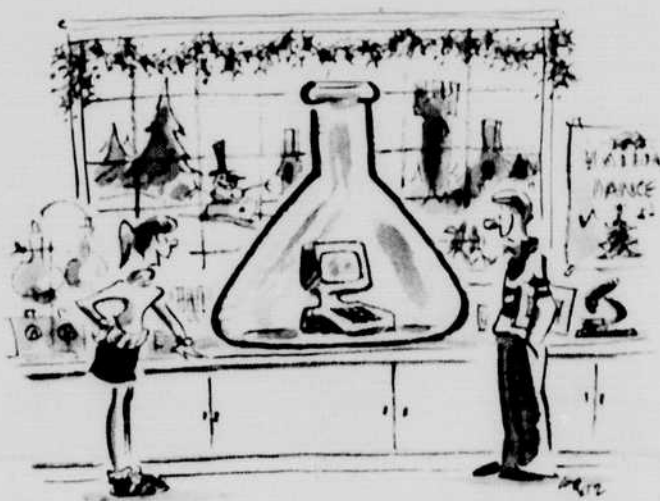
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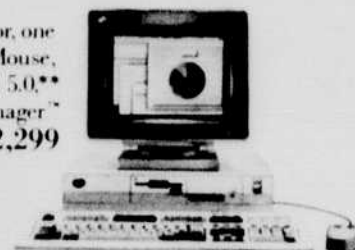
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
