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(in Portland) has a similar gate," Brombaugh said. "The gate closes a one-block section during a performance, creating an extension of the lobby between buildings."

"A marker at each entrance of the mall would help define the downtown," Cheng said.

"It struck me as an interesting architectural design," Brombaugh said. "A gate-like structure — two markers — could have street lights, a clock or signs on it."

Eugene Mayor Jeff Miller would like to reopen Willamette Street to help attract more traffic and business to the downtown area while others feel that Willamette Street should remain closed. Eugene City Councilor Emily Schue is one of those opposed to a re-opening.

Last March, 16 architecture students were chosen to work in a downtown Eugene studio to design and develop models for different types of space downtown. The idea came from Daphne Walwyn, the owner of the Schaefer's Building.

Jim Gibbons, adjunct professor at the University School of Architecture, presented slides of the student's work to the city council.

"The idea came from Daphne and her real estate agent Jim Barnhart," Gibbons said. "There was a good link between the University's resources and Daphne's resources."

The students were chosen through a competition. Interested students filled out a sheet with their project preferences.

"The students met with Daphne to help define the project," Gibbons said. "There were no preconceived ideas. The preliminary studies showed that there was lots more to do than the students thought."

Gibbons also said downtown organizations were brought in to share ideas with the students. He said the students also got to see City Council meetings, planning department meetings and meet with a retail task force.

Both Cheng and Brombaugh were pleased that the Council

liked their work.

"I was pleased with the Council's response," said Brombaugh. "I felt the Council took our group's work seriously."

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
