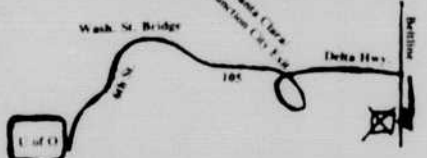

him to see so much hatred coming from other communities.

"People put too much time trying to make something into more than it is," he said. "I'm not necessarily asking anyone to appreciate what I do or respect the fact that I am a female impersonator. But I am asking you to respect my privacy."

Although Sable said he has not been the victim of assaults, he knows other female impersonators and other gay and lesbian people who have been assaulted.

"I don't think it's fair," he said. "It's hard to understand why, in a world so filled with pain, oppression, starvation, and disease, why we all can't get along."

"I see art in what it is that I am doing," he said. "I consider myself here to entertain. I don't see perversion and I don't see someone who is confused with whether he's male or female."

Sable said he has been fortunate because his family has been very supportive of who he is and what he does.

"When I first came out (of the closet), my family was very accepting," he said. "In fact, my mother's exact words were 'I thought you had something to tell me,' implying I wasn't telling her anything she didn't already know."

In 1988, when Sable was crowned ISCEE's Princess XV, his two sisters and his parents were in the audience, he said. And the support goes on. Sable said his father and younger sister both plan to drive to Eugene from Bend for the show in the EMU Ballroom tonight, weather permitting.

Sable's act ends with the close of each performance. The make-up, costumes, wigs and accessories are removed and returned to the closet to remain there until the next show, he

said. He is once again David.

Despite the criticism from all ends of the spectrum, Sable said sacrifices must be made.

"The show must go on," he said. "We're trying to show people something that they don't normally get to see. They can see anyone on the street, they can go to a movie or they can come to a female illusionist revue and they can see something that will literally blow them away."

The benefit performance tonight will help the University's Gay and Lesbian Alliance with planning upcoming Pride Week.
