Women breeze past WSU 80-71

Oregon dominated Washington State from the tipoff Thursday night notching an 80-71 victory in women's Pacific 10 Conference basketball action at McArthur Court.

Junior forward Trina McCartney poured in 21 points on

(Kasperski) which left it open for me," McCartney said. "They were double teaming Stef which left the lane open on the inside, so I could drive and pass off or drive and shoot."

Kasperski, Oregon's record-setting center, outmuscled the double teaming to match McCartney's point total of 21 by dumping in 13 in the second half. Kasperski pulled down 13 rebounds as well, 11 of those on the defensive end.

A small attendance of 395 observed a game that was never really close, although the Cougars gave the remaining spectators a heart sputter the day after Valentine's Day.

The Ducks held a 76-61 advantage with 3:19 to go in the game. Three fouls in 26 seconds by sophomore center Marne Smith, coupled with Oregon turnovers off a full-court Cougar press, and the Ducks' lead dwindled down to five at

76-71.

During the Cougars' 10-point run, the Ducks reserves failed to get the ball past the half court line.

"I was experimenting a little bit, and it sort of got away from us," Oregon coach Elwin Heiny said. "Once we inserted our starters again we were right in there."

The Ducks answered the Cougar run with four free throws by senior guard Michelle Eble to ice the game at 80-71.

The first half was far from pretty as the Ducks opened a quick 6-0 lead. The Cougars cut the lead to one at 11-10 at the 10:51 mark, but would never come that close again.

Oregon extended its lead to 10 at 22-12 with 6:30 remaining in the half. The difference hovered around 10 for the remainder of the half, with the Ducks going to the locker room leading 37-28.

The Ducks and Cougars traded hoops for the first four minutes of the second half. The Cougars cut the lead to seven at the 15:21 mark off a jumper by sophomore forward Kristal Stahl.

That is when Eble took charge. The 5-foot-6, 120-pound guard nailed two three-pointers in a row to bump the Oregon lead up to 13 at 53-40.

Eble finished with 15 points with 4-6 shooting. She was 3-4 from long range.

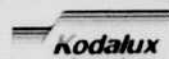
