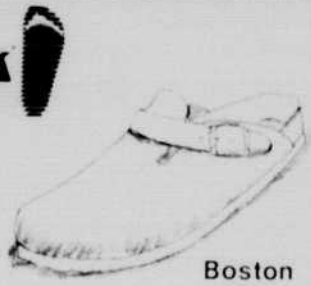

**IFC gets replacement members**

New members Chad Bennion and Joe Revill joined the Incidental Fee Committee Thursday night, immediately following confirmation by the Student Senate.

The new members were appointed by ASUO President Andy Clark to replace former IFC mem-

bers Jack Maynard and Elizabeth Neely, who resigned three weeks ago. Bennion served on the committee during the 1988-89 school year. Revill, who has no previous ASUO experience, is a finance major.

Two groups, the Pre-Law Society and Rideshare, failed to show as scheduled, and must now submit a written explanation of their absence to the IFC within five working days of the

hearing date, or fail to have their budgets approved for next year.

The committee also voted to eliminate an internal IFC limit prohibiting the committee from decreasing by 25 percent the budget of a group that has been on campus more than seven years, and instead decide each budget on a case-by-case basis. The committee voted unanimously, with IFC Chair Tonija Swires abstaining.

In other business, the committee approved budgets for six student groups.

The *Oregon Voice* received \$2,700 for the 1990-91 budget season, a 12.62 percent decrease from this year's \$3,090 allocation.

Pocket Playhouse, a student theater group, received \$1,609 for the 1990-91 budget season, a 22 percent decrease from this year's allocation of \$2,066.

Men Against Rape received \$1,929 for next year, a two percent decrease from this year's \$1,985 budget.
