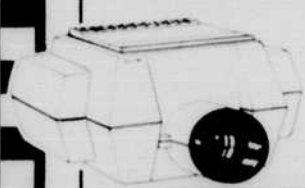

quirements, if a college or university experienced an outbreak, the board had to authorize treatment before an institution could respond to the situation.

The board meets monthly, which often delayed treatment of outbreaks, Sellers said.

The new rule gives university and college presidents authority to adopt immunization requirements and requires the presidents to notify the board when they do.

In another decision, the board approved a request to the emergency board of an increase of \$2.8 million to build the Casey Eye Institute at the Health Sciences University.

The institute is named for United Parcel Service co-founders who gave nearly \$4 million for the institute, which will contain 112,000 square feet in five stories.

It will accommodate instruction, research and patient care in ophthalmology and will be the only regional eye institute west of St. Louis and north of San Francisco.

The board approved all consent agenda items deferred from the Jan. 19 meeting.

One of the items is the external review policy for new graduate programs. The board also authorized OHSU to establish an interdisciplinary Institute of Interventional Therapy.

In addition, the board authorized OSU to establish a Marine/Freshwater Biomedical Sciences Research Center, and approved the Minority Scholarship Program for Students with Junior Standing for underrepresented minorities.

The next higher education board meeting is March 16. The emergency board meets March 15-16.

the early 1970s is not as effective as the current vaccine.

In addition, many of today's college students lack adequate vaccination protection because they entered school before school immunization laws took effect in many states.

About one in 10 people with measles may develop complications, Jackson said. One type of complication is inflammation of the lining of the brain, which potentially may cause brain damage.

University students can fulfill the measles vaccination requirement by being immunized with either a measles vaccine, a combination measles-rubella vaccine or a combination measles-rubella-mumps vaccine.

These shots are available from private physicians and public health agencies. The measles vaccine is available, without an appointment, to University students at the Student Health Center for \$22.

Waivers of the new requirement for medical or religious reasons will be granted, Jackson said. In addition, students attending summer term only are not required to meet the measles vaccination requirement.
