Celebration and education will be combined at a party planned tonight by Students Against Apartheid to commemorate the release of formerly imprisoned black liberation leader Nelson Mandela.

In keeping with the theme of the celebration, "Mandela is free, now free South Africa," organizers of the event point there is still a lot of work to be done to abolish apartheid.

"Of course we want people to have fun too," said Thomas Unold, a member of SAA.

The event, scheduled for 7 p.m. in the EMU Ballroom, is open to the public at no charge. However, SAA will be asking for donations to help pay for the event.

The celebration will include two musical groups and several speakers. The speakers planned for the event are Dr. Edwin Coleman, director of the ethnic studies department at the University and noted civil rights activist; Jan Oliver from the office of Multicultural Affairs; Chuck Dalton, president of the Eugene/Springfield chapter of the NAACP and Nithi Muthukrishna, a black South African student studying at the University.

Performances by the two musical groups will open and close the ceremonies. Inspirational Sounds Gospel Choir will open the event at 7, and More Time, a local reggae band, will play at 8:30. Unold said that More Time has composed an original song especially for the event.
