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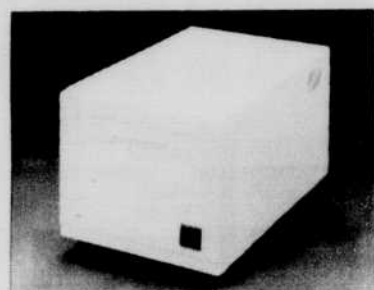
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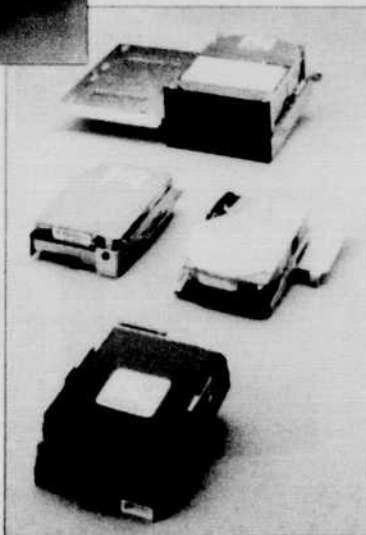

Monson gets first win in Seattle

Brandon's shot secures it, 58-53

The Oregon men's basketball team overcame cold shooting, weak rebounding and a nine-point deficit to take a 58-53 win over Washington Saturday in Seattle's Hec Edmundson Pavilion.

It was also Oregon coach Don Monson's first win over the Huskies in Seattle since coming to Oregon. It marked the first four-game sweep of the Washington schools by Oregon since the 1974-75 season.

As has been the case several times this season, sophomore guard Terrell Brandon was called upon to save the Ducks.

Brandon responded by hit-

ting a tough 15-foot jump shot with 16 seconds remaining in the game and two remaining on the shot clock to help seal the win over the Huskies.

"It was a tough shot and he

hit it," Monson said. "We had the play called for him to take it to 15 seconds and he hit it."

"It was just a great athletic play," said Washington coach Lynn Nance. "He shot it over two guys. We really didn't want to get in a situation where one shot could decide the game like that."

Brandon's shot, which gave the Ducks a 56-53 lead, came after Washington's senior guard Eldridge Recasner, a 91 percent free throw shooter this season, missed the front end of a one-and-one, blowing a chance to tie or put the Huskies on top.

"When Eldridge was at the line, I thought he nailed them both," Monson said. "But it happens. It just happens."

Guard Kevin Mixon, who spent most of the game chasing Recasner in the Ducks' box-and-one defense, was called for the foul, sending him to the

bench with his fifth and giving Recasner the free throw opportunity while Oregon nursed a 54-53 lead.

Washington forward Dion Brown got the offensive rebound — one of the Huskies' 22 offensive boards in the game — but was tied up by Oregon forward Keith Reynolds, giving Oregon possession.

After Brandon's last basket, Recasner missed an off-balance three point attempt with Oregon guard Mike Helms in his face. The shot missed and Reynolds grabbed the rebound. He was fouled, and finished the game scoring with two free throws.

Oregon got the win despite being hammered on the boards by a 37-22 count. There were times in the game when it looked like Washington was playing volleyball under the basket with five Ducks as spectators.

The Ducks offset their rebounding, which Monson called "atrocious," by outscoring the Huskies 19-7 from the free throw line. Oregon also forced 15 turnovers, including eight steals, from Washington.

After a slow first half — the score was 23-all at the break — Washington came out and grabbed a nine-point lead at 38-29 with 14 minutes left.

Oregon was victimized by a 15-6 run by the Huskies in the first six minutes of the half. Doug Meekins and Brent Merritt scored eight and seven points, respectively, to account for all of Washington's points
