

Ducks finish second at Arizona

Larson gets first victory

The Oregon softball team took second place in the Arizona Softball Classic in Tucson Sunday as UCLA handed the Ducks a 2-0 shutout in the championship game.

Sophomore pitcher Katie Wiese, who pitched three complete games Sunday, took the loss to the Bruins, giving up

single runs in the second and third innings. Wiese ran her record on the season to 7-3.

The Ducks reached the finals of the tournament by defeating Minnesota 1-0 in the quarterfinals and Arizona 2-1 in the semifinals. Wiese gave up three hits in each of the completegame victories.

Oregon and Minnesota went through six scoreless innings before left fielder Vicki Fry hit a two-out RBI single with the bases loaded to score shortstop Danny Senner.

Senner reached first base on an error by the Gopher shortstop and was moved to second on a sacrifice fly by catcher Joely Eilers. An error on Minnesota's left fielder allowed Senner to go to third, setting up Fry's winning RBI.

Arizona jumped out to a 1-0 lead, but Oregon scored two seventh-inning runs to take the win. Eilers doubled to start the inning and, after a fly-out by Senner, Tracey Simmons

walked. Joanna King then reached on an error, scoring Eilers. Kristl Okuhara, who plays second base, then singled to score Simmons to round out game scoring.

Oregon reached the quarterfinal round by defeating U.S. International 5-1 and Oklahoma 2-0 Saturday.

Sophomore pitcher Jan Larson got her first win of the year in the two-hit shutout of Oklahoma while Wiese threw-hit U.S. International.

Oregon began Tournament play Friday, beating Ohio State and Pacific, but losing to Long Beach State 5-2.

Junior catcher Julie Cayanaugh and Okuhara were named to the all-tournament team for Oregon.

Oregon's record now stands at 10-9 overall and 1-3 in Pac-10 play. The Ducks get a break until March 10 when they host Oregon State at Howe Field in a non-conference doubleheader.
