

to submit a request for a second hearing.

Laura Callahan, president of the Pre-law Society, said she was not present at Thursday's budget hearing because she was not notified it would take place.

"The first time I found out about it was on Friday," Callahan said. "I would have never

known I'd missed the meeting unless I read the *Emerald*."

Callahan said she left messages for the IFC because she hadn't been notified of the hearing date for Pre-law Society and was never contacted by phone or mail.

Callahan said she also left a message at the IFC office Thursday, the day of the hear-

ing, but that her call was never returned.

Morales said groups are contacted regularly by IFC members and have no excuse for not showing up at their designated hearing time.

Groups are notified by mail two weeks before their scheduled meeting. One week in advance groups are notified a

second time by mail or by phone, and a reminder call is made one to three days before the hearing, Morales said.

"They can't say that we never contacted them," he said.

Morales said the problem is that some of the groups do not regularly check their mail in the ASUO office, so they do not know what is going on.

Callahan said although she did not check her mail until Friday, the day after the hearing, she found no messages from the IFC in her ASUO box or in her box at Oregon Hall. If anything had been sent by the IFC it should have been there, Callahan said, as she is the only one who picks up the mail.

Callahan said she is submitting a written statement explaining that she was never informed.

"Basically I'm going to say I was not contacted, and so I didn't go to the meeting," she said. "I don't see why they won't approve it. I feel somehow since I did not get contacted, it should not be held against me."

She said she believes a mix-up in communication was inadvertent. "We may have just been one of those who were skipped or slipped through the system," she said.

methods effectively to restore the kind of control that existed before the fighting broke out (in 1987)," Stampfer said.

Stampfer said the United States is partially to blame for the lack of peace negotiations in Israel. He said the dialogue that has been opened with the Palestine Liberation Organization has led nowhere.

Stampfer said the United States has disregarded the importance of the situation in Israel for too long. He said the Bush administration has a tendency to ignore human rights issues.

"In the light of all that's been happening in Eastern Europe, this has been put on the back burner," he said. "I don't think the Bush administration, any more than the Reagan administration, is interested in a peace settlement in Israel."

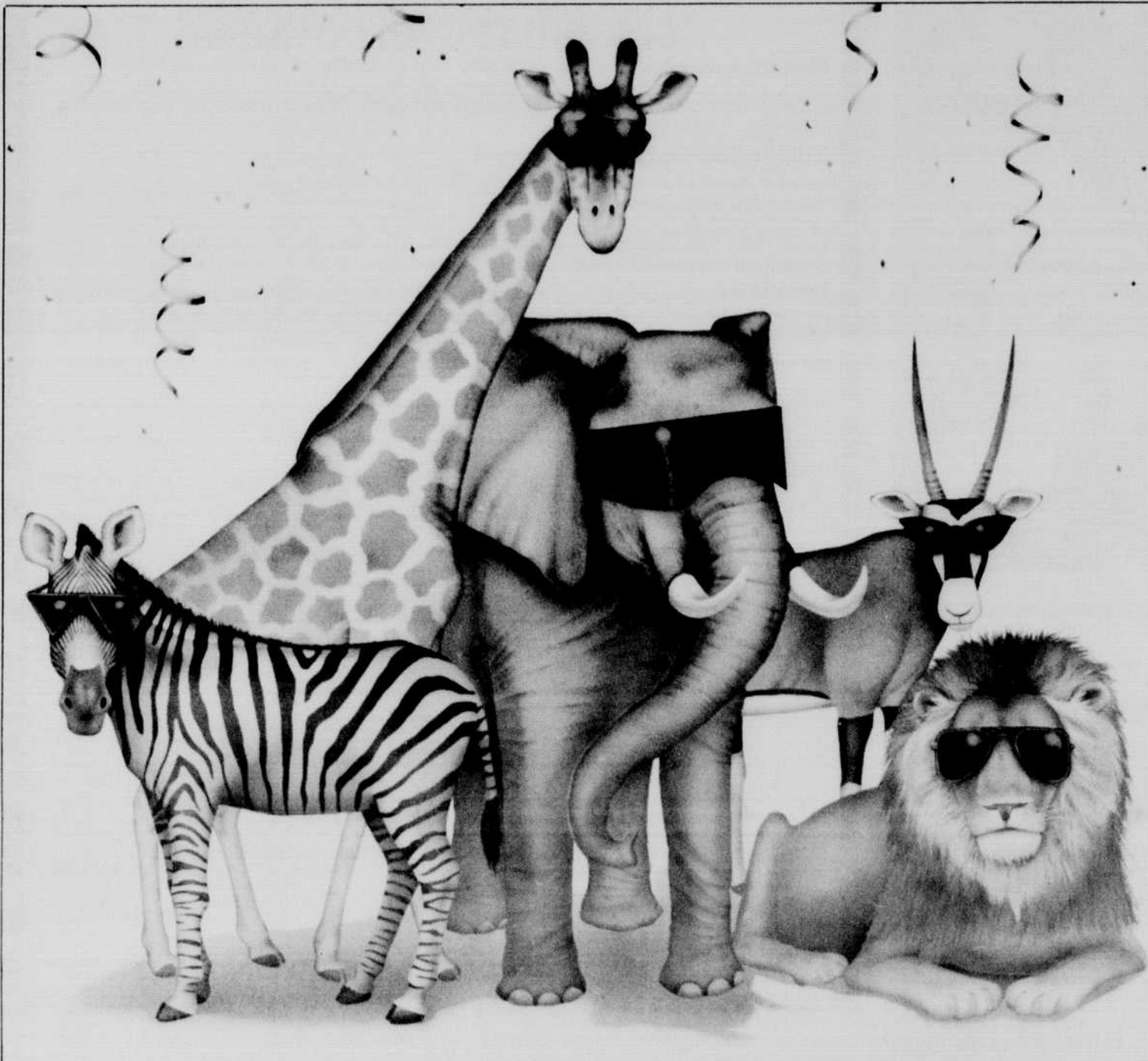
