with the Bruins and Trojans are especially important, not only because he came from the Los Angeles area, but after playing on a summer league team that included UCLA's Tracy Murray, Zan Mason and Darrick Martin and USC's Chris Munk.

"I know the guys well, so I want to beat them," Dunn said. "It's also my last two games at Mac Court and it's been great playing here."

A sociology major who will graduate this summer or next year, Dunn has plenty of options for the future.

He plans to get an internship and do a lot of work with probation and eventually do something along that line or in correctional services, or possibly serving as some type of counselor or adviser.

Dunn also hasn't ruled out the possibility of giving up basketball just yet.

"With basketball, it depends," he said. "I haven't had enough success in it. I think the ability is there, but I'm not thinking about that right now."

Ranniger, a 6-3 guard, has been around for five years now and has witnessed it all for the Ducks.

He has been the hero off the bench, the big scorer as a starter and a forgotten player off the bench. He played on one NIT

team, played on last year's 8-21 team and now has a chance to wrap up his career on another postseason bound team.

After an outstanding prep career in both football and basketball at University High School in Spokane, Wash., Ranniger chose to play basketball over football for two reasons.

"Mainly I chose basketball over football because I didn't think with my speed I could compete at the level I wanted to in football, but I felt I could quickness-wise in basketball," he said.

"It's really weird because after my senior year (in high school) I lost interest in football," he added. "It kind of got old."

Ranniger earned two starting assignments in his first year as a Duck during the 1985-86 season and scored in double figures in two games.

The following season Ranniger suffered a stress fracture in his foot and redshirted, but came back the next season to be the first guard off the bench. He had a good season, hitting over 40 percent of his shots from the three-point line. Probably his most memorable performance came that year when he sparked a win at Arizona State with 19 points off the bench.

Last year Ranniger was the starting off-guard for the first

five games and was playing well, averaging 8.0 points per game, including a career-high 20 against Whitworth, before spraining an ankle.

"It was disappointing because I had the stress fracture my sophomore year and then got hurt again," Ranniger said. "But after the injury I got out of shape and it's tough to come back when everyone was in midseason form."

Ranniger did return, but scored only 23 points in his last final 15 games and never was able to regain his shooting touch. However, Ranniger doesn't believe the injury has had any lingering affects this season although Kevin Mixon, not Ranniger, is starting at the off-guard spot.

"Kevin came and he's playing well," Ranniger said. "I think that was really the only factor."

Although Ranniger's career hasn't been what he had hoped it would be, he has been able to put things into perspective.

"It's been very up-and-down," he said. "I've had my high points and my low points. I'm getting married after school, and that's the best memory I'll get out of school, that relationship."

"I gave it a shot," he added. "I haven't failed in any sense. It's been rewarding, and I've learned a lot about life. I think I'll be able to deal with life's setbacks a little better after my injury my sophomore year and playing so well last year before getting hurt."

Ranniger will graduate this spring with a degree in rhetoric and communications and a minor and hopes to one day go into business management.

And on Sunday, Reynolds, Dunn and Ranniger will lead the Ducks onto the Mac Court floor for the final time in an Oregon uniform.

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
