**Clark encourages students to vote**

Andy Clark has a goal for this year's ASUO election — to dramatically increase student turnout at the polls.

"I want to see at least 50 percent of the student body get out and vote, at the very least," he said to a group of students at

Carson Hall Wednesday night.

Clark said he has made an effort to reach the student population and educate them about the ASUO and added that students should demand the same of other student groups.

"You could quite possibly be paying \$100 to \$110 per student per term next year for services that are coming out of (the EMU). How many other student groups have you heard from that have received your money?" Clark asked.

Clark said forcing student groups to go to the voters for funding will help make the groups more accountable.

"If all those programs go to the ballot from now on, they're going to be in a sorry position when they realize they didn't do any outreach, and try to educate people about what they do," he said.

Clark said he hopes that the issue of student group funding will get students to turn out at the polls this spring, and he also hopes that the proposed mandatory student health insurance initiative will have the same effect.

Clark said he has been disappointed with the student participation in the insurance issue so far, and that the majority of the student body has not put forth an active voice in an issue that affects them.

Clark said only 30 people, including administrators, showed

up at the student insurance forum last week. This happened despite the \$800 spent on publicity, and 5,000 flyers distributed in issues of the *Oregon Daily Emerald*.

Sean Wilson, Stafford resident assistant, asked "how can students in housing become more involved in campus issues?"

"Mobilize and vote spring term," Clark said.

Frank Miles, a resident of Sheldon Hall, asked if voting booths will be placed in the residence halls this year, an idea turned down last year.

"We're working on that with RHGC. (Residence Hall Governance Committee) There was a big stink during last year's election when someone said that voting booths in the residence halls would be an advantage to Clark and Wyckoff.

"One of the most disturbing things I heard at an elections board meeting last year was when someone said that the dorm residents weren't as educated on the issues," Clark said.

Clark said he is hoping for a greater turnout from dorm residents, as well as from the rest of the student body.

"Student elections aren't ever respected because only 9 percent turn out for the vote," Clark said. "It's your right not to cast that ballot, but if you don't vote, don't bitch."
