Ducks need victory over Bruins

Third place in the women's Pacific 10 Conference is on the line Friday as Oregon travels to the Los Angeles area to tangle with UCLA.

Oregon, 8-4 in the Pac-10, is a half game behind the Bruins who are 9-4 in conference play. Both trail Washington and Stanford who are tied for first place at 12-1.

The fact that the NCAA has never taken more than three teams from the Pac-10 into the NCAA tournament adds a lot of pressure to both UCLA and Oregon.

UCLA plays a pressure defense as well, but it is of a different nature than the type Washington played. The Bruins focus their attention on Kasperski by double- or triple-teaming her inside, Heiny said. That opens up the outside for Oregon's shooting guards.

And it is a good thing Oregon did hit the outside jumpers. Kasperski was held scoreless in the first half of their first meeting with UCLA, and in fact never even got off a shot until the second half.

"In the past, (UCLA) has doubled up on Stefanie. Fortunately, in the last game we were able to hit the outside shots, and I hope we could do the same again," Heiny said.

Heiny sees shooting as the key to victory for his team.

"I honestly think if we just shoot well and don't turn the ball over, we can score," Heiny said. "We have people that can score, and our offense has been

able to get good shots. We just have to execute."

Sunday's contest with USC is a game the Ducks cannot take lightly either. The Ducks cannot afford to lose to a team lower than them in the standings if any hopes of a third-place finish and an NCAA bid are to stay alive.

The Ducks defeated the Trojans handily (80-58) last month at home, but the Ducks have lapsed on the road before. Oregon was upset by Arizona State earlier this month in Tempe — a loss that is now adding extra pressure to the Ducks to win.

"They too have some players that if they get on tune, they can be very good," Heiny said of the Trojans. "We just have to hope that they are not in tune."

The Trojans do not have a player that can match up with Kasperski inside, Heiny said.

There is one concern Heiny

80-66 in McArthur Court in January, after holding off a late rally by the Bruins.

"I hope if we get a lead we don't allow them to come back. I think the main thing is that we just have to execute," Oregon coach Elwin Heiny said. "In that game, we missed some shots that were good shots. That's how they came back. I'm hoping it doesn't come down to that this time."

Oregon is coming off a tough loss at home to fifth-ranked Washington. The Huskies stumped the Ducks' offense with a pressure defense, and held Oregon to 52 points.

Washington keyed on Oregon's shooting guards, and let Oregon center Stefanie Kasperski get what she was going to get inside, Heiny said. That hurt the Ducks more, as Oregon produced little points from long range.

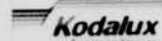
