Hillel Shabbas, a vegi-potluck affair, will be held tonight

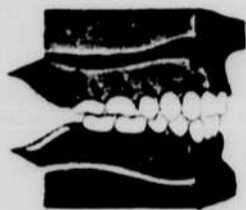
