The Ducks improved to 10-6 in the Pac-10, good for sole possession of fourth place and 15-10 overall. The Trojans fell to 4-12 in the conference and 9-14 overall.

Monson had said earlier in the month that 15 wins should lock an NIT bid, but he changed his mind after the game

"Well, now I say 16." he joked. "You've got to keep telling those kids something."

Oregon took control of the game midway through the first half and led 48-35 at the break with Brandon scoring 17 points. The Ducks then ran away from USC in the opening minutes of the second half and went on to win.

As with Thursday's win over UCLA, the Ducks used torrid shooting to get the job done. Oregon shot 62.3 percent from the floor for the game and was a sizzling 19-of-28, 67.9 percent, in the surround but

"Terrell was tough and Reynolds had an outstanding offensive game." Monson said. "We shot the ball well pretty well the last two games, and it's surprising how much better better you are when the ball goes in."

On this day it was tough to single out the best individual performance for the Ducks because there were so many.

In the first half, Brandon did it all, giving Oregon a 25-20 lead on a dunk after a Mixon steal. Later he hit a three-point play and nailed two jumpers before hitting two free throws after the first half buzzer to give the Ducks a 48-35 lead.

Then he got the three seniors in the act in the second half, handing out five of his nine assists and even changing a few plays so Ranniger could spot up behind the three-point line and bomb in trevs.

"It was a special day for the seniors, and I wanted to give them a win," Brandon said. "It was the last moments for them, and it was important for them as well as the team, this being our last

home stand.

Reynolds, who had 10 points at the break, hit a three-pointer to start the second half and then Dunn tallied two three-point plays as the Ducks built a 57-37 lead with 18:22 remaining.

Six more points from Reynolds gave the Ducks their biggest lead of the season at 24 points, 68-44

The Trojans wouldn't die though and pulled within 10 at 79-69 on two Miner free throws with 5.26 remaining

The Ducks responded by going on a 12-2 run to seal the game.

"We had a little lapse there with about eight minutes to go." Monson said. "but our kids were tough I thought we did a good job rebounding, passing the ball, and we played adequate defense."

Monson then pulled the seniors, first Reynolds, then Dunn, and finally Ranniger as all received standing ovations as they went to the bench, playing the roles just as might have been scripted.


