## Thief nabs tapestry from Willamette Hall

A tapestry in Willamette Hall was reported stolen to the Office of Public Safety on Saturday.

The tapestry hung in the west corridor of Willamette Hall, about 10 feet off the ground and within reach of a six-foot person, said physics management assistant Sandy Ryan, who first reported the theft.

Entitled "Boat House," the 72-by-51-inch, linen-inlay tapestry by Portland artist Judith Fawkes depicts boats in "muted brick red and bluish green," said Lotte Streisinger, coordinator for the One Percent for Art Program for the University science buildings.

Ryan first discovered the tapestry missing on Saturday afternoon, at about 3:15 p.m. "I just came into the building and

happened to go down that way," Ryan said.

The tapestry had been in Willamette Hall when she left the building at 5 p.m. on Friday, Ryan said.

"There wasn't any reason for it to be gone," Ryan said. "The hook pointed downward so it obviously had been ripped down."

Ryan checked with the University Museum of Art and Streisinger before reporting it stolen.

The tapestry, which had been in Willamette Hall since No-

vember, is one of a kind and irreplaceable, Streisinger said.

The One Percent for Art Program, part of the Oregon Arts Commission, purchased the tapestry, which is valued at \$3,440, Streisinger said.

Anyone who has information about the theft is asked to call the University planning office at extension 6-5562.

In addition, the Oregon Arts Commission is offering a \$100 reward for its return, said Nancy Lindburg, the commission's arts services coordinator.
