

ASUO to sponsor information on entering measures on ballot

Students who want to find out how to put a measure on this spring's ballot, or who have other questions about the upcoming elections, can attend an informational drop-in forum today from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. in EMU Cedar D.

ASUO vice president Scott Wyckoff, Constitution Court chairperson Carolyn Ladd and representatives from the ASUO elections board will be present at the meeting to answer questions about the ballot-writing process and campaign deadlines.

The forum is the first in a series designed to get students more involved in student body elections. Although today's meeting will focus on ballot measures, students can ask any questions concerning election procedures.

"It all falls under the heading of voter education," said Andy Clark, ASUO president.

Measures will need signatures from 5 percent

of the student body, or about 900 students, to be placed on the April ballot, said Dylan Coulter, chair of the ASUO elections board. A signature from President Andy Clark can also send a measure before the student body for a vote.

Students also need to have the wording of a measure approved by the Constitution Court before it goes on the ballot, Coulter said.

Besides information on the filing procedure, Wyckoff, Ladd and elections board members will be able to offer advice on the logistics and time commitment required to place a measure on the ballot, Coulter said.

The deadline for filing ballot measures is March 30.

General elections will be held April 26 and 27; primaries will be a week earlier, on April 19 and 20.

mined), but the student was in the same area where some known cases of measles have been," Mowrer said.

The student, described as a female undergraduate student, broke out in a rash Sunday evening and went to the health center Monday morning, Jackson said.

Jackson said the student at-

tended classes last Wednesday, which was the first day she was contagious, Jackson said. She did not go to class Thursday or Friday.

The health center made arrangements for the student's roommates to be immunized, and officials will notify the student's classmates of the possible exposure, Jackson said.

"We're going to the classes and talking to the students which this student was in, and we're urging them to get a booster dose of measles because we're trying to prevent some further cases from occurring down the line," he said.
