

Walton receives recycling pilot

Dorm to reduce paper use

A student campaign encouraging dorm residents to recycle paper products they use in the residence halls and in the cafeterias has prompted University Housing to approve a pilot recycling project in Walton Complex.

Bins for white and colored ledger paper and for newsprint will be placed in Walton lounges and its laundry and garbage rooms as soon as final arrangements are made with Pearl Buck Recycling, said Dick Romm, residence life director for University Housing.

Pearl Buck, the group that recycles paper from University departments and administrative offices, will add the cans to its pick-up route.

Success of the recycling program rests on the willingness of residents to separate their paper garbage and bring it to recycling bins, said Kristen Downey, a member of the Survival Center's recycling committee.

"We want to incorporate students as much as possible," Downey said. "We can't just let other people be in charge."

To encourage students to participate in the program, committee members plan to hang posters, distribute fliers and write letters to each dorm advisory board explaining the pro-

ject. Representatives from each dorm in Walton will work with committee members to supervise the project.

A similar push to encourage dorm residents to use fewer paper cups and napkins has significantly reduced paper consumption in the dining halls, said Fred Babcock, director of food service for the housing department.

At the suggestion of recycling committee member Alexandra Foote, the dining halls have posted signs asking students to use glass instead of paper cups and to cut back on napkin use.

Foote said she first became concerned about the amount of paper waste in the dining halls when she moved into the dorms fall term.

"It's appalling how much gets thrown away," Foote said. "People take stacks of napkins and get a new paper cup every time instead of reusing the old one."

Foote calculated that in one year 3,000 dorm residents use 8.6 million napkins and 4.3 million cups. She has been working with Babcock and dining hall managers to make residents more aware of the number of paper products they use.

Originally, Foote asked dining hall supervisors to make paper cups available only on request, but supervisors were reluctant to dictate to residents, she said.

"It's our intention to try not

to tell college (students) what they should do," said David Funk, food service supervisor at the University Inn.

However, students in all three dining halls seem to be responding positively to signs and table tents asking them to use glass instead of paper cups and to take only one napkin, Babcock said.

Funk estimated use of paper cups and napkins at the University Inn has dropped 40 percent in the last few weeks. "Traditionally the UI uses more paper products than the other dorms," Funk said. "We've cut down a lot."

The effort to conserve paper could also save the housing department money, Babcock said. "The money we save on paper products we can spend on food," he said.

The recycling project will likely be expanded to other dorm complexes if the Walton pilot project is successful, Romm said.

"Our main concern is safety hazard," Romm said. "We will be looking at how quickly the cans are emptied, especially those in the lounges."

"It also depends on if Pearl Buck has the manpower to work on a significantly larger program," he added.

Pearl Buck should be able to adjust to any size program, said Jon Davis, Pearl Buck recycling coordinator.

"Depending on the logistics and energy, I feel flexible enough to accommodate any situation," he said.
