solution ready before the next academic year. Brand said the current policy is not legally discriminating.

He next answered questions dealing with the rhetoric and communications department at the University and the proposed student health insurance plan.

About the Rhet Com department overcrowding problem, Brand said it is difficult for a university to respond immediately to enrollment shifts.

"It is not just overcrowding, but also that there is a great interest in the rhet-com department," he said.

The question dealing with

the possibility of a mandatory health insurance policy centered around how the University could legally bind students to pay.

Brand said it would be a mandatory fee that students would be required to pay to attend the University. He did point out that the University did not accept the recommen-

dation from the Student Health Insurance Committee that the University have a mandatory insurance policy.

The forum ended with a discussion between Brand and the member of SETA. Brand questioned what was wrong with speciesism, and the SETA member invited Brand to attend SETA's next meeting.
