Troupe bringing back hit musicals

The last 20 years of award-winning musicals will come to life tonight as the University Song and Dance Troupe presents its first Beall Concert Hall performance of the year.

The show, titled "Two Decades of Tony Tunes." will begin at 8 p.m., and is expected to run for close to two hours

"Two Decades of Tony Tunes" will feature 30 songs from four Tony award-winning musicals of the 1970s and 1980s: Sweeney Todd, by Stephen Sondheim; Little Shop of Horrors, by Alan Menken and Howard Ashman: The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, by Carol Hall; and Les Miserables, by Claude-Michel Schonberg, Herbert Kretzmer and Alain Boublil.

The Song and Dance Troupe usually does not pick a show theme, but rather picks a central composer or a central music style. The Troupe decided to pick a theme this time around to pull the whole show togeth-

"We decided to pick four shows and tell each story through dance, song, dialog and a synapsis in the program," said Wade Willis, the Troupe's co-student director. "Having a theme like this makes the show more congruent.

The performance will be split up into two acts, with a short intermission between them to allow the Troupe to adjust the set and modify their costumes.

The Troupe will present each of the Tony plays in turn, "with song unfolding from the dialog," explained Willis. "We picked certain lines from the plays and we will act them out. The songs will follow the dialog.

Four men and four women comprise the student ensemble, with two others assisting in the way of instrumentation - keyboard and bass. "The mix of four men and four women works very well for dance," Willis said

Willis said there is no other performing group like this one on campus, and he hopes people will realize

There's nothing else like this on campus anywhere nothing like it - and I hope people who come to see this show get a surprise about our performing group." he said

'We perform song, act song, sing song and move all together." he said, which makes the Troupe a cam-

conte and bronze are the many mediums united in this display of beauty and exploration.


