

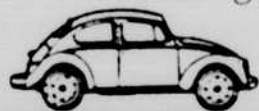

Women's post-season hopes dim

Arizona over Ducks, 79-74

The Oregon women's basketball team lost a game it had in hand to Arizona 79-74 in McArthur Court Saturday night.

The loss was twice as painful as an ordinary loss. The contest was the last appearance in Mac Court for Oregon's three seniors, Michelle Eble, Jacquie Semeniuk and Stefanie Kasperski. They had hoped for a better farewell.

A second sting was felt as well, as hopes for post-season play went out the door with the loss to the Wildcats.

"We knew that we had to win this game, and win one next week to still have a shot at post-season play," said Oregon coach Elwin Heiny. "This clearly wiped us out of any contention. It's frustrating, and it's disappointing, but Arizona played a great game."

The Ducks appeared to have the edge with eight minutes to play when they held a five-point lead at 65-60. Neither team could find the range in the next 2:30 minutes until Arizona center Amy Livingston hit a wide open six-foot jumper with 5:48 left to play.

Arizona guard Timi Brown followed that with an open 17-footer closing Oregon's lead to one at 65-64. Brown led all scorers for the game with 22 points.

Freshman guard Vanessa Selden put the Ducks back up by three with a jumper of her own off the dribble. Selden finished with 16 points in the game, 14 of which came in the second

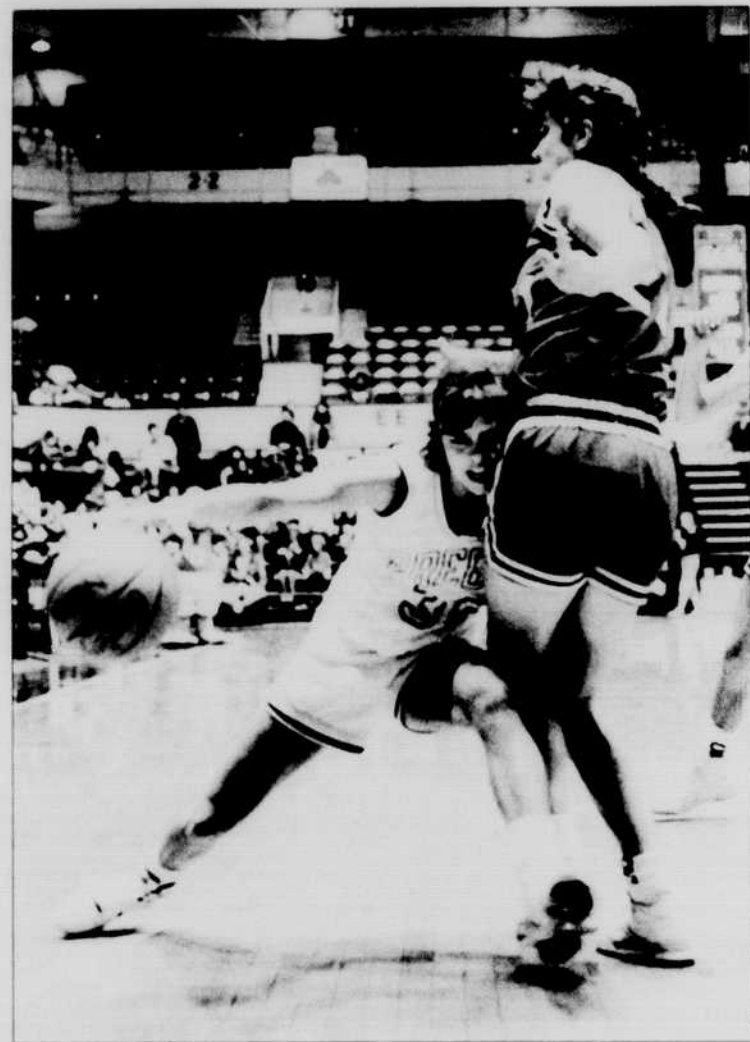

half. The Duck lead bounced from one to three until Arizona grabbed its third lead of the half at 72-71 off center Julie Meyer's turn around bucket.

Semeniuk answered by making one of two free throws at the 1:59 mark and knotting the score at 72-72.

That is as close as the Ducks would get as Brown capitalized on Oregon defensive lapses by hitting two straight wide open baskets.

"We didn't get back on defense, and their offense was very simple to run," Heiny said. "It was throw the ball up the court quickly, quickly and shoot. And they did a great job of it. It's amazing how they shot."

Guard Melissa Handley added two free throws to extend Arizona's lead to six at 78-72 with 34 seconds to go.

Selden would add a final hoop for Oregon, and the Wildcats sank a free throw to set up the final score of 79-74.

The transition defense of the Ducks was their downfall, as Arizona's guards canned open jumper after open jumper.

"I think it was not getting back on D," said sophomore forward Staci Wallenborn. "I think their transition killed us, getting the ball and passing it all the way down the court."

Wallenborn led the Ducks with 18 points on 8-12 shooting.

Kasperski, Oregon's leading scorer, had a rough time in the middle making just 5 of 16 attempts for 14 points. The 6-foot-7 center did pull down 12 rebounds.

Semeniuk had 12 points and six boards in playing all 40

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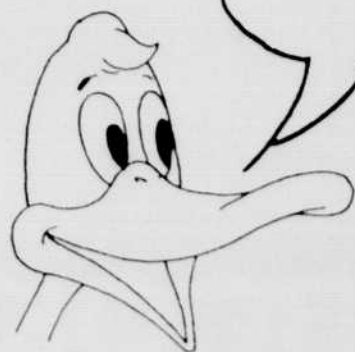


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
