Fonseca places third in marathon

May qualify for Championships

Oregon's Peter Fonseca, competing for his native Canada, placed third in Sunday's Los Angeles Marathon in his debut in the 26-mile, 385-yard event.

Fonseca, a junior at Oregon who was part of the Ducks second place NCAA cross country team this past fall, was timed in 2:12:07.

Fonseca had decided to enter the race because marathoner Art Boileau of Eugene, who trains with Oregon coach Bill Dellinger and the Ducks, was the defending champion and had already entered the race. However, Boileau finished fifth, more than two seconds behind Fonseca.

"It helps when you train with the guy," Fonseca said. "He (Boileau) ran all right."

Fonseca, who qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 10,000 meters back in December, ran the fastest Canadian time of the year and said he might have qualified for the World Championships with the time.

"Things are going great," he admitted. "I've been training a lot and I kind of needed this."

On top of the NCAA qualifying mark in the 10,000 and the outstanding marathon time, Fonseca has made a complete recovery from a stress fracture

he suffered last spring that caused him to miss much of the 1989 track season.

"I'm doing more distance work and not a lot of speed work like 200s and 400s," he said. "I've changed things and I don't kill myself everyday."

While Fonseca was in southern California over the weekend, the Oregon track teams were in action at the Icebreaker Open in McMinnville Saturday.

The appropriately named meet, which was once again

plagued by cold and rainy weather, saw several Ducks post some good marks as they prepare for the outdoor season.

Junior Paula Berry, seeking to put last year's disappointing season behind her, won the javelin with a toss of 166-5. The mark was Berry's third best throw ever and just off the NCAA qualifying standard of 168-0.
