Oregon met University of Puget Sound for the semi-finals and got off to a slow start. At halftime, UPS led 55-10.

But it was all Oregon in the second half; the team didn't let UPS answer a single question. Until then, the team will prepare for the finals. Matz said he was surprised the other teams at the regionals took the competitions so seriously. Many teams had coaches, advisers

Matz said the University team had done nothing to prepare for the regionals.

"Part of the key to our success is our relaxed attitude." Matz said. "I don't think any of the other teams went bowling during the tournament."

"College Bowl doesn't really take a 'steel-trap' mind.' Prowell said. "It takes more of a 'lint-trap' mind. It helps if you have the sort of mind that just picks up useless bits of junk and trivia.

Oregon's team members were drawn from the top three teams to finish in the campus tournament last month Matz and Uhre were from the first-place place Truckin' for Jesus II.
