"I hope this will be just the start of a long-lasting relationship.

Miyake said his company does not expect to realize any direct benefits from the donation other than to show their appreciation for doing business with Nike and improve relations with Oregonians.

'Sometimes Japanese are criticized for making too much money." Miyake said. "I'm sure this will change some views of some people of Oregon ... that we are not a moneyeager, moneypursuing compa-

Akira Watanabe, consul general for the Japanese consulate in Portland, said the 21st Century will be the age of the Pacific and that this type of gift fosters good relations.

'It is vital that the citizens of both our communities learn to work together," Watanabe said. "It is important for (Nissho Iwai) to accept the responsibilities that come naturally with being a citizen of this state.

The Knight Library expansion and renovation is a \$27.4 million project, with more than \$17 million coming from the state's general fund.

The University, which is required to raise the remaining \$9.35 million, still needs to raise an additional \$2.4 mil-

The most significant thing about this is it continues an effort to keep Oregon's best library in the ranks of the best libraries of the United States." Goldschmidt said.

Knight said serious discussions about the gift began five months ago, but that the 'seeds' for this type of donation were planted when Goldschmidt first took office and began fostering relationships with Japanese businesses


Knight said from the start of the negotiations that the money was earmarked for the library expansion project. The library was renamed in 1988 for the Knight family in recognition of their support.


The project, which is tentatively slated to begin in spring 1991 and finish in late 1992. will add about 130,000 square feet to the library.


George Shipman, University librarian, said the second floor will house the library's Asian literature collection.

Shipman, in an interview with the Oregon Daily Emerald in late February, said the library currently seats eight percent of the student population. which is far below the national average of 25 percent.


