

Environment to be women's day theme

The Eugene community will commemorate the 1990 International Women's Day with a parade, music, poetry, films and speakers that reflect the progress of the women's movement and the solidarity of women worldwide.

Beginning Thursday night, the Unitarian Church will hold an event focusing on international women's issues with the theme "Women in Struggle.




