**Environment to be women's day theme**

The Eugene community will commemorate the 1990 International Women's Day with a parade, music, poetry, films and speakers that reflect the progress of the women's movement and the solidarity of women worldwide.

Beginning Thursday night, the Unitarian Church will hold an event focusing on international women's issues with the theme "Women in Struggle."

The program will include a poetry reading from *Voices from South Africa* and excerpts from the videos *South Africa Belongs to Us* which features the lives of several South African women, and *You've Got to Move* which portrays women taking on leadership roles in grassroots struggles in the southwest United States.

"The theme that ties all of this together is the power of women to make change and to take control of their own lives," said Marion Malcolm from Clergy and Laity Concerned, one of the program's sponsors.

On Saturday, the Lane County chapter of the National Organization of Women is sponsoring a day-long event highlighting "Women and the Environment," the theme chosen by the United Nations for International Women's Day.

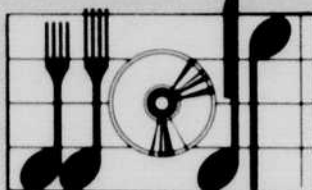
The event will feature local women focusing on local issues through entertainment, speakers, food and crafts booths at the Eugene Downtown Mall after a morning parade starting at the EMU courtyard.

Karen Wood from Earth First! will speak Saturday along with Nancy Dunn, president of the Eugene Commission on the Rights of Women, who will speak on three issues targeted by the commission for the 1990's — violence against women, the feminization of poverty, and reproductive choice issues.

"I think it's nice they're giving people a chance to focus on women's issues," Dunn said.

The NOW Lesbian Caucus will present a musical comedy by Sally Sheklow, "The Sound of Lesbians," at the Westmoreland Community Center Saturday night followed by "The Saddle Soars," Eugene's only all-women band.

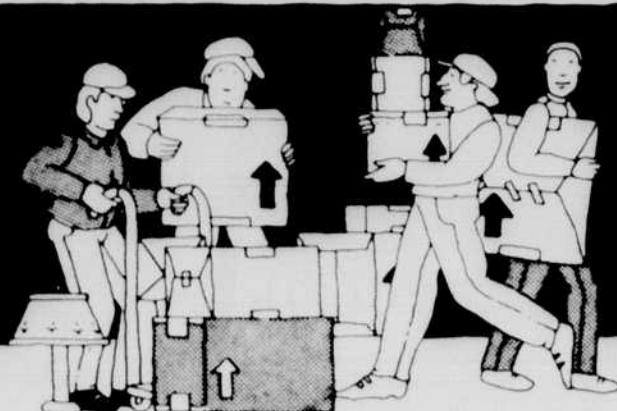
