Stanford runs away from Oregon, 75-45

It was good news-bad news for the Oregon women's basketball team Thursday night at Stanford.

The good news is the Ducks played one of their best games of the season. The bad news is Oregon lost the game 75-45.

Oregon was in this game for the first 30 minutes of play, much like they were against the Cardinal in McArthur Court earlier this year.

With 7:02 remaining to play, the Ducks were within twelve at 53-41. The second-ranked Cardinal went on a rampage in the next three minutes, scoring layup after layup keyed by Oregon turnovers.

At 4:05, the Ducks found themselves in a deep hole down 67-41. The Ducks managed only two baskets in the last seven minutes of the contest.

Oregon coach Elwin Heiny was impressed with his team's effort, despite the final lapse.

"If we would have played as well as we did here, our record would have been a lot different," he said. "We really did play well with (the Cardinal) for 30 minutes."

Tara VanDerveer, Stanford head coach for the last four years, was equally impressed with Oregon's effort.

"That was the toughest 30-point win we've ever had," she said.

Holding the Cardinal to 75 points is an achievement in itself, and it marks the second lowest output by Stanford this season.

The 31 percent shooting mark the Ducks held the Cardinal to in the first half is the lowest percentage in any half by Stanford this season as well.

Heiny credits his team's defensive effort for the low numbers of Stanford.

"Defensively, we mixed it up quite a bit, and I think it kept them a little off guard," he said.

Stanford did set a school record in the process of whooping the Ducks by putting up 87 shot attempts for the game.

Jennifer Azzi, last year's Pac-10 player of the year for Stanford, led all scorers with 19 points. Azzi shot 4-9 from the three-point stripe.

The Ducks were annihilated on the offensive boards, grabbing only eight to Stanford's 28. The Cardinal outrebounded Oregon for the game 48-39.

Turnovers, which have been a problem area for the Ducks of late, were again a factor.

"We turned it over way, way, way too many times," Heiny said. "Turnovers led to layups, and their transition game was outstanding."

Senior Stefanie Kasperski, in her second-to-last game as a Duck, led the Ducks in scoring with 14 points. Freshman

guard Vanessa Selden got back on the shooting track with her 10 points on 5-9 shooting.

The Ducks found themselves down by only eight at the midway break at 31-23. The Cardinal extended their lead with two unanswered baskets in the first 2½ minutes of the second half.

Oregon countered by scoring the next eight points, closing to within five at 35-30 with 14:02 to play. The two teams played even for the next seven minutes, before the Cardinal turned on the afterburners and ran away with the game.

Oregon, now 9-8 in the Pac-10 and 17-10 overall, play Cal Saturday at Harmon Gym.

Stanford, 26-1 overall and 16-1 in the conference, face the lowly Oregon State Beavers in its next clash.

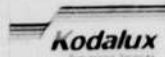
