Board prepares for spring vote

With the filing date for student body offices just three weeks away, only four candidates have announced their plans to run for office, and no one has officially filed with the elections board, said elections coordinator Ken Dodge.

Students interested in running for any elected position must file by March 30.

However, Dodge said he is not surprised at the lack of candidates. "Most waited till the very end before putting in their filing petitions," he said of last year's elections.

Dylan Coulter, elections board chair, attributed the lack of filed petitions to political strategy. "A lot of people's technique is to wait and not file right away," he said. "I think we'll see more people filing."

He noted that although current president Andy Clark and vice president Scott Wyckoff announced their candidacy in mid-February last

year, they held off filing until close to the deadline.

Any registered, fee-paying student at the University is eligible to file for office, Coulter said. Students must provide verification of status, such as a fee card, he said.

Positions open for spring elections include ASUO president and vice president, four one-year Incidental Fee Committee seats, two two-year Incidental Fee Committee seats, two two-year EMU board seats, 12 Student Senate seats (three seats are for a half-term only), and two one-year President's Advisory Council seats.

Primary elections will be held on Thursday April 19 and Friday the 20th. General elections will follow on April 26 and 27.

To ensure political parity, the elections board has tightened up some campaign records regulations, Coulter said. For instance, the board recently clarified the definition of in-kind contribu-
