counseling program, and is working toward her high school diploma.

Helen also has another challenge to face — cancer.

"If your husband or someone were here to give you a hug it would be different, but because you're alone it's like a double

whammy," she said.

Helen thanks her friends and Camp for helping her through the difficulties. She said she refuses to dwell on her troubles and advises others to also maintain a positive approach.

"Why should you go through life like a dud? Some people

exist, but they quit living," Helen said. "I think if there's any help anyone can get — go for it!"

The program is not limited to widowed and bereaved family members such as Helen. It also assists people who have experienced the death of someone

close to them — even a pet.

"It seems difficult for people to seek counseling. I try to paint a more realistic picture of what counseling is. We help people through the pain," Camp said.

The program serves people who have experienced a loss recently or in the past, and is also open to those who just want to talk and "sort out what some problems might be."

"I have a respect for people who come in. It's a sign of strength, not weakness," Camp said.

Camp said it is often more difficult for people with losses from the past to ask for help

when society says they should be over it.

"Some people initially think they can handle it, then after several years it hits them," she said.

For people interested in support group assistance, the program makes referrals to the Bereaved Support Group at Sacred Heart and the Widow and Widower Support Group at McKenzie-Willamette Hospital.

The Widowed and Family Grief Counseling Program, located at 1627 Agate St., is open 9 a.m. to noon and 1:30-5 p.m. Monday through Friday. For information call 346-4220.

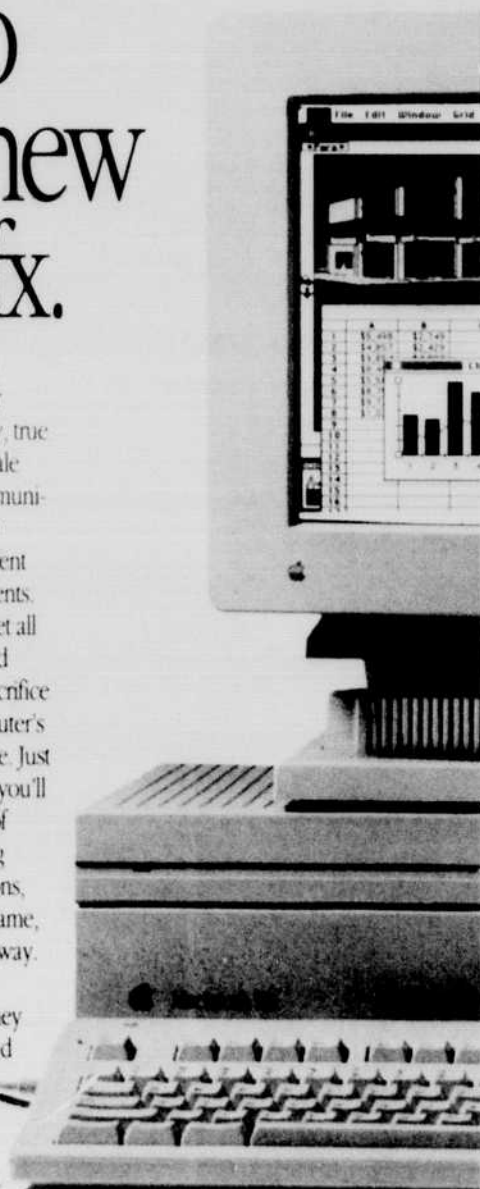

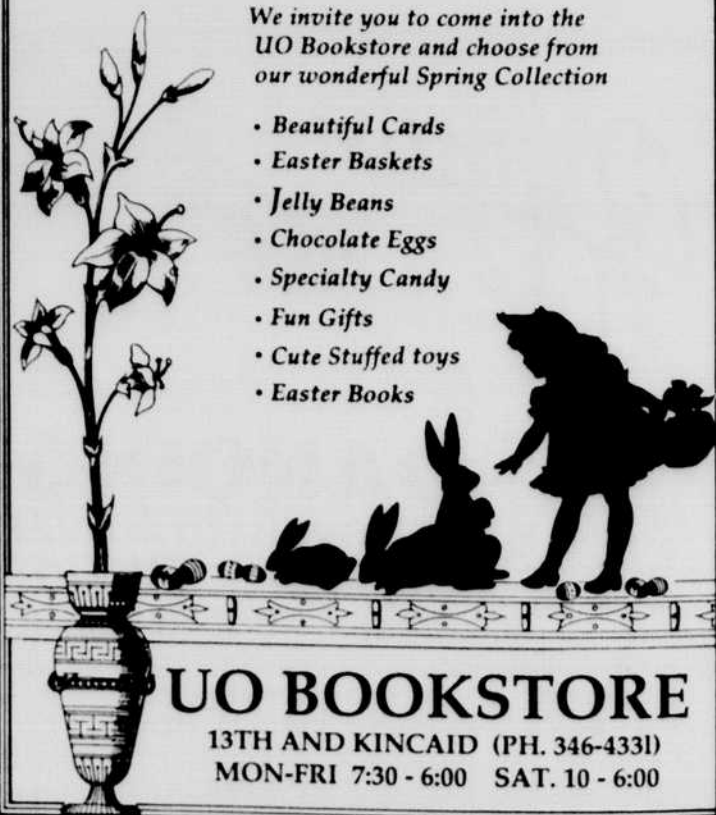
