

Police Beat

The following is a list of campus area crimes taken from Office of Public Safety and Eugene Police Department reports between March 15 and 26:

- About \$7,000 in property was reported stolen from the Recreation and Intramural Activities office in Room 103 Gerlinger to EPD on March 26.

Unknown suspects cut the security cables and padlocks to two Apple computers, which they stole along with two Apple printers, a 35mm camera and \$16 cash. The theft occurred sometime between March 24 and March 26 in the office, which showed no signs of forced entry.

- A Galena quartz crystal at Columbia Hall was reported stolen and its glass display case damaged to EPD on March 23.

A University custodian in the hall discovered the

case broken and the crystal gone after investigating a crash. The crystal is valued at between \$1,200 and \$1,500, and the case damage is estimated at \$5,600.

- EPD received a report of a stolen \$500 cassette deck from the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity, 812 E. 14th Ave., on March 22. A fraternity resident staying over spring break discovered the cassette deck missing from its cabinet.

- A University employee reported a case of public indecency at the Computing Center to OPS on March 21.

The employee observed the suspect masturbating while sitting on a bench between the Computing Center and Chiles Center.

The employee called campus security, who searched the area but found no suspect. The suspect is described as a 5-foot-6-inch, 125-pound, brown-haired white

male, last seen wearing gray baggy shorts, a light-colored shirt with a white T-shirt underneath, and carrying a skateboard. EPD is continuing investigation of the incident.

- A pair of binoculars and a padlock were reported stolen from a residence at 14th Avenue and Kincaid Street to EPD on March 20. The items had a \$165 total value.

- A case of criminal mischief was reported to EPD on March 17. An unknown suspect threw a Gatorade bottle through the \$200 rear window of a Toyota parked at 15th Avenue and Kincaid Street.

- EPD cited two University students and a visiting student for being minors in possession of alcohol on March 16. OPS officers observed the students drinking at the 1600 block area of Columbia Street, and EPD was dispatched.


