# Campus leaders urge students to follow good neighbor policy

With spring term and good weather here, student body officers, administrators and law enforcement officials are working together to prevent good times from turning into bad situations.

Three committees have been formed to examine community relations issues, including communication between police and students, and to take steps to prevent incidents such as last year's May 5 riot, where police arrested three University students at a campus-area party.

After that incident, a meeting of community, police, and University administration and student leaders was called to discuss whether there was a problem — "an attitude of confrontation" — between police and students, said ASUO University events coordinator Kirk Bailey.

"The riot last year, it was good weather, it was a celebration day," said ASUO President Andy Clark, a member of the short-term intervention committee. "It's not to say that it won't happen again this May, but we have to make every effort we can to make sure it doesn't."

As part of this effort, the committee mailed letters earlier this week to all addresses in the 97403 zip code area. The mailings included a cover letter from Clark and police officer John Rutledge, and information on how to keep parties from getting out of control.

"It's a preventative effort rather than a reactionary effort," Bailey said.

Brad Perkins, chairman of the West University Neighborhood Association, said he believes the mailings are a good idea.

"I think the mailings are a good start," Perkins said. "Anything to start communication between the city and students."

"I think that people feel it is a little intrusive sometimes, that the police are on their doorstep, and they feel that they are in trouble," Clark said. "Sometimes they're not in trouble, it's just that the police are addressing the situation one way or the other."

As another step in improving communication with the police, Clark has gone on two "ride-alongs," accompanying police officers on patrols of the campus area.

"One thing I observed was that the officers never responded unless a complaint had been called," Clark said. Two of the three complaints about parties he witnessed on ride-alongs were called in by other students, Clark said.

"You don't have older community members calling in the parties and busting the kids," he said.

Perkins agreed that older residents generally do not call in complaints. "People in this neighborhood put up with a lot of noise," he said. "But when it goes night after night, after one in the morning, then it's a problem."

"It goes into that area of respect," Clark said. Clark suggested that students hosting parties invite their neighbors, or at least let their neighbors know when a party will be taking place.

During his patrols with the police, Clark said he was disappointed by some of the student behavior he witnessed, including urination on private property.

"I'm a little discouraged by that, because they are University students, and that's a reflection on the University," he said.

"We're not trying to come down on the students, to dictate the way they need to live their lives," Clark said. "But one thing needs to be understood — we're part of a larger community, and we're active, vibrant members who contribute financially and socially and culturally to Eugene."

"We need to respect that, and we need to act that way," Clark said.

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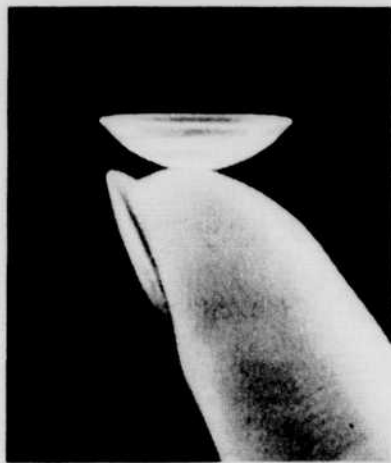


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
