Annual Fools Run set for Saturday

It's not too early to think about April Fool's Day, at least not for participants in the eighth annual Fools Run in the Rain, a race and costume event set for Saturday, March 31 at Alton Baker Park.

Gorilla suits, diapers and colorful jester outfits replace tank tops and tights for many participants who choose to dress for this race. Costumes are a Fools Run tradition, said Linda Phelps, specialized recreation supervisor for the Eugene Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services department.

Entry forms are available at Eugene Parks and Recreation community centers, area sporting goods stores, and the parks and recreation main office at 22 W. 7th Ave.

"You can wear just about anything and get away with it," Phelps said.

Ribbons will be awarded in jester, team/family, most creative and 12-and-under categories; there will also be a "best of show" trophy.

New this year is an eight-kilometer run in addition to the one-mile fun run. "We want people to come out who are looking for a fun family event, as well as people who are serious about running," said Carol Brewster, city special events manager.

Until Friday at 5 p.m., the fees to enter the race and receive a T-shirt are \$8.50 for adults and \$6.50 for youth ages 12 and under. The fee is \$3 for no T-shirt. On the day of the race, the fees are \$10 for adults, \$7.50 for youth and \$4 for no T-shirt.

The event begins with the costume judging contest at 10:30 a.m., followed by the one-mile race at 11 a.m. and the eight-kilometer race at 11:30 a.m.

Both races begin on Day Island Road next to the Alton Baker parking lot and continue east along the canoeway.

"The one mile is an easy run, the 8K a bit more challenging, and the costume event is fun for everyone," Brewster said.

The title of the race implies that participants run in the rain — but it has only been the case once, Phelps said.

The race course is entirely paved, making it suitable for strollers and wheelchair users, Brewster said.

And if it doesn't rain this time?

Proceeds from the race will go toward recreation scholarships for youth and adults with physical and developmental disabilities, according to Carrie

"It would be just fine with me," Phelps said. Last year was the first time the run was held on April Fools Day, she said — "and it rained."
