Women net four wins on road trip Team plays well in California matches

After beating Seattle University 9-0 at home March 16, the women's tennis team came away with four wins out of eight matches in southern California over spring break.

The Ducks defeated Northern Colorado 8-1, Westmont College 9-0, Long Beach State 8-1 and Montana State 8-1 but lost to Fresno State 8-1, Loyola Marymount 5-4, Cal State-Los Angeles 8-1 and Cal State-Fullerton 7-2.

Although it was hard for coach Tom Greider to be pleased with a split, he said he thought his team played well.

"The quality of schools we played was much better than the schools we played last year," he said, referring to last year's spring trip. "We beat two Division I teams and had a chance to play in front of some potential recruits, which was an extra bonus."

Greider said that the toughest match might have been against Loyola Marymount, who, like their men's basketball team, played with a lot of emotion after the death of Loyola basketball star Hank Gathers.

Oregon played Loyola March 22, a day before the basketball team played in the NCAA West Regional Semifinals. "They had his (Gathers') number 44 embroidered on their shorts and played with a lot of emotion. They played a higher emotional match than we did."

The Ducks trailed 4-2 after the singles matches with the Lions, but won at No. 2 and No. 3 doubles to pull even at 4-4 before Oregon's No. 1 team of Kumi Nagamoto-Amber Goheen lost in three sets as Lovola won 5-4.

Nagamoto and Goheen had the match squared at one set apiece and were tied 1-1 in the third set before the Lions' top team won the next five games.

The Ducks had a much tougher fate with Fresno State with only Goheen winning at No. 3 singles, 4-6, 6-0, 6-4 to keep Oregon from being swept. Goheen and Valerie Stukovsky were tied 4-4 in the final set before Goheen won the last two games to take the match.

The Ducks lost all three doubles matches with Fresno State and the other five singles matches. All of the matches except Goheen's were decided in straight sets.

"The highlight of the match was Amber's win because we haven't been shut out all year." Greider said. "She played the best match I've seen her play in my two years (as Oregon coach)."

Oregon also had a tough time with Cal-State Los Angeles, the sixth-ranked Division II team in the nation.

The Ducks played Montana State on the Cal-State courts the morning of March 24 with only a half hour break before meeting Cal-State Los Angeles that afternoon.

"It was real dirty and smoggy, and everybody felt the effects," Greider said. "That's not an excuse for losing, because their players had to deal with it also, but it makes you appreciate Eugene a lot more."

The Ducks had better luck in later matches with Northern Colorado and Westmont College as they breezed to 8-1 and 9-0 victories, respectively, while also beating Montana State and Long Beach State by the same scores.

In the match against Northern Colorado, Greider cited No. 5 singles player Margaret Fraleigh, who came from one set down to win the match in three sets, 5-7, 6-4, 6-2
