Hurdlers Bob Gray and Brian Wright also debuted with good early season times in the high and intermediate hurdles respectively in the Sacramento State Invitational.

Gray won the highs in 14.31 and Wright was first in the intermediates with a 52.26 time. Wright also won the high hurdle race at the Oregon Preview in 14.55

Defending Pac-10 long jump Latin Berry, who had been impressing the professional football scouts over the winter won his event in both meets. sailing 24-0 4 at the Oregon Preview and 24-0% at last Saturday's meet.
