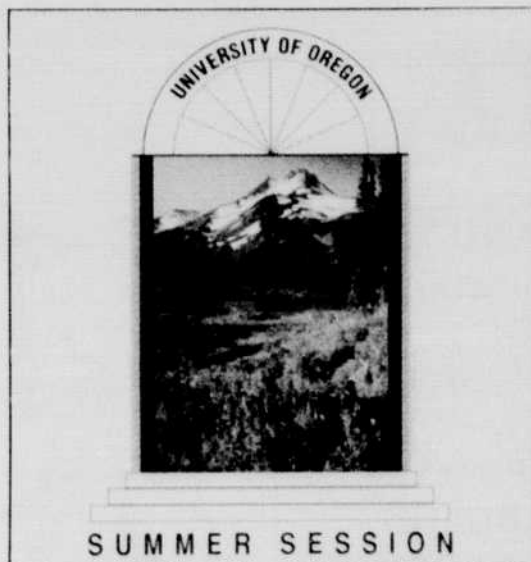

# Northwestern hires music dean

The dean of the University's School of Music is leaving to take the position of dean of the School of Music at Northwestern University.

Bernard Dobroski was a member of the Northwestern University faculty for 11 years prior to coming to the University in 1986.

"It was a choice between two loves," Dobroski said. "I came to the University of Oregon from Northwestern and I fell in love with this area. It's been a very difficult decision to make."

Dobroski will only be the sixth dean to head the school at Northwestern, which was established in 1895. The school is ranked among the top five music schools in the country.

"The University of Oregon has excellent administrators and it's not surprising that institutions of Northwestern University's caliber would look to us for their leadership needs," said University President Myles Brand.

Brand said that in coming weeks he will appoint a search committee to begin a national search for a new dean.

Provost Norman Wessells, vice president of academic affairs, said he will be sad to see Dobroski go.

"It is a sad development for us and all Oregonians who have known and appreciated Bernie's leadership contributions, but a joyous one for Bernie since it offers him an exceptional opportunity to build a great music school in the United States," Wessells said.

Wessells said Dobroski has been a vigorous fund raiser for the University and has recruited outstanding faculty and students.

"His time here has put in

place a foundation on which we will build," he said.

Dobroski received his bachelor's degree in music performance from Carnegie-Mellon University in 1968 and his master's degree in music performance and music history from Catholic University of America in 1972 as a Danforth Fellow.

He received his doctoral degree from Northwestern in 1981, also as a Danforth Fellow.

Dobroski has given numerous professional performances as a tubist and keyboardist in the Eugene, Chicago, Washington D.C. and Pittsburgh areas.

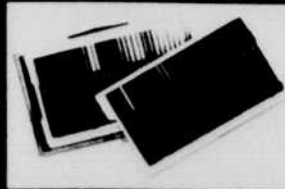
