

Campaign petitions due today in Suite 4

Campaign petitions for all elected student body offices must be submitted to the elections board in EMU Suite 4 by 5 p.m. today.

Candidates for ASUO president and vice president and students who wish to run for seats on Student Senate, the Incidental Fee Committee, the President's Advisory Council or the EMU Board should turn in a completed elections petition, available in Suite 4, and show a valid student fee card and a photo I.D.

The elections petition asks candidates for basic information such as address, major, year in school and the position

they are running for.

Voter's guide statements, typed and double-spaced, are also due by 5 p.m.; guidelines are available from the elections board.

As of 5 p.m. Thursday, the elections board had received petitions for president and vice president from Kirk Bailey and Sheila Stickel, who announced their campaign March 8.

The other candidates who have announced their campaign for president and vice president, Steve Maples and Diane Cushman, have not yet filed.

Candidates have also filed petitions for each of the follow-

ing positions: two for one-year IFC seats and one for a one-year seat, one for President's Advisory Council and one for EMU Board. Two students have filed for Student Senate seat 6. In addition, one student has filed for seat 5 and one for 16.

Traditionally, students wait until the last day of the filing period to submit their petitions, said Dylan Coulter, elections board chair.

"I was looking through the petitions from last year, and the vast majority filed at the last minute," Coulter said.

The following are job descriptions for student officers to be elected later this month:

As chief officer of the ASUO executive, the **student body president** appoints staff members to oversee areas including finance, student events, University and state affairs, minority affairs and the women's task force. The president also directs the executive office in special projects.

IFC members are responsible for allocating more than \$4.5 million in student fees to about 75 ASUO-funded programs and student groups. Members review program goals and budgets in weekly meetings and hold daily budget hearings in February and March.

Four one-year seats and two two-year seats are open.

Student Senate members are elected for a two-year term. They attend weekly meetings and represent the student body at the University Senate and the University Assembly, which determine general campus policies. Members also approve executive appointments and run the Information and Grievance Center in the EMU.

Nine full-term Senate seats and three half-term (one year) seats are open; each seat represents different schools or departments in the University.

Two students will be elected to two-year seats on the **EMU Board**, which forms policies and plans for the student union. The Board allocates office space and EMU lobby space and deals with other issues related to the building. The board also prepares a budget for the EMU and all of its programs.

Two students will also be elected to the **President's Advisory Council**, which meets monthly with the ASUO president to discuss matters of student concern.

Candidates for all offices will meet for an informational meeting Wednesday April 4 at 6 p.m. in EMU Cedar Room F.
