Huskies trounce women Ducks

Oregon women's track coach Tom Heinonen said before the meet with Washington Saturday that if the Huskies ever had a chance to beat the Ducks, this was the year.

No doubt. Heinonen would like to have been wrong about that statement, but he was all too prescient as the Huskies narrowly defeated the Ducks at Husky Stadium 73-63.

The Husky win ended a 12-

year domination by Oregon against the Huskies in Pacific-10 Conference action. Oregon last lost to Washington in 1977.

The meet came down to the last event of the day - the triple jump.

Washington's Celia Willis jumped 37-7% to take the event while the Huskies' all-purpose track athlete Angie Tasker held down the second spot with a leap of 37-31/4.

Oregon athletes grabbed third, fourth and fifth in the event, but it was not enough to prevent Washington from notching the victory.

"We were trying to get it down to the last event." Heinonen said. "We were scrambling for every point all during the meet.'

The difference in the meet was Washington's experience. Led by seniors Tasker and Joyce Schweim, the Huskies outhustled a young Oregon squad.

Tasker was busy throughout the meet competing in an incredible six events. Tasker finished third in the long jump. first in the 400-meters, third in the 200, and ran a leg on the winning 4x100 relay and the second-place 4x400 relay.

Heinonen was amazed that Washington coach Orin Richburg used Tasker in six events. 'I don't think Jackie Joyner

has even competed in six events." Heinonen said.

Heinonen, who has been at the helm of the women's track program as long as the win streak against the Huskies, added that he would never run one of his athletes in six events.

Schweim competed in four events for Washington, running a meet record 13.69 in the 100 hurdles and another meet record 60.56 in the 400 hurdles. She also anchored the winning 4x100 relay team and ran third leg in the 4x400 relay race.

''(Schwein and Tasker) are both really solid athletes. Heinonen said. "Tasker has been a thorn in our side for vears

Oregon sophomore Kim Hyatt began the meet on a bright note for the Ducks by taking first in the javelin with a throw of 169-4. Junior Paula Berry threw for second in the event (153-5).

Sophomore Laurel Roberts and freshman Kelly Blair grabbed first and second in the high jump. Roberts posted a personal record leap of 5-11 while Blair jumped 5-7

Blair's jump was impressive considering she has only practiced with the Ducks for three weeks. Blair missed early season practices because of commitments to the women's bas-
