Hall had taken place in spring football drills the morning before the meet. And two other football players, Beno Bryant and Orlando McKay, also played key roles.

Bryant was third in the 400 and McKay was third in the 200. Hall and McKay also ran on the Huskies 400-meter relay team that finished first in 40.42.

Oregon's Wright suffered another close loss as Bernard Elison won the 400-hurdles in 51.33 to Wright's 51.39.

Not only did Washington have 1-2 finishes in the events they were expected to dominate — the shot put, discus and high jump — but the Huskies also went 1-2 in the 5,000 meters with Adam Leahy and Bruce McDowell.

Brad Hudson and Peter Fonseca, Oregon's top long dis-

tance runners, "let the pace go too slow," Dellinger said, and were unable to pull the race out at the end.

Fonseca was third in 14:08.81 while Hudson finished a non-scoring fourth in 14:15.23.

"Peter ran a good time," Dellinger said. "Brad and Peter are primarily 10,000 runners and need to open up more of a lead (in a 5,000)."

Despite the loss, the Ducks had outstanding performances in the field events.

Javelin thrower Art Skipper, who almost didn't compete because of a groin injury, beat defending Pacific-10 Conference champ Darryl Roberson. Skipper's top mark was 236-3 while Roberson's best throw was 233-2.

Scott McGee had an easy time of it in the hammer with a

winning throw of 210-11. Oregon got an unexpected second out of Nick Anastassides who threw 186-6.

Latin Berry and Spencer Williams went 1-2 in the long jump while Williams won the triple jump and Berry was second.

kethball team.

Freshman Erika Klein may have been the biggest surprise of the meet after she took first place in the 800 with a time of 2:11.44. Sophomore teammate Karen Hutson was a close second at 2:11.62.

Rosie Williams, the Ducks sprinting sensation, clocked an 11.86 to take the 100 victory. She followed with a victory in the 200 at a time of 24.15.

Williams wasn't through, however, running an incredible anchor leg for Oregon in the 4x400 relay. Williams' split time was 55.4 as she helped pull the Ducks to victory. Oregon's win in the relay made the triple jump the deciding event.

"She literally got up off the Astroturf to run anchor for the 4x400," Heinonen said of Williams' exhaustive effort.

Senior Liz Wilson stayed true to form with her two victories in the 3,000 and 1,500, clock-

ing a 9:34.68 and a 4:29.71.

Junior Kamala Kohlmeier put in a solid performance for the Ducks in four events. Kohlmeier finished second in the 100 hurdles behind Schwein's record pace and placed third in the 400 hurdles with a time of 62.47. She took fourth in both the long jump and triple jump.

Heinonen noted that of all the athletes Oregon took up to Seattle, only five were seniors. Only two of those seniors scored for the Ducks.

"(Washington) knew this was their big chance, and they took advantage of it," Heinonen said.

Next year will be different, Heinonen said, adding that this was Washington's "moment in the sun."

The Ducks host Washington State and Boise State this Saturday at Hayward Field in their next Pac-10 dual meet.

Wiese splits at Sac State

Oregon sophomore pitcher Katie Wiese tossed a two-hit shutout Saturday to give the Ducks a 2-0 win and a non-conference split of a double header at Sacramento State.

Oregon dropped the first game, 2-1, in nine innings when Sacramento State got a

run in the bottom of the ninth to take the win. Oregon led, 1-0, with two outs in the bottom of the seventh, but gave up a run on a passed ball and an error for the tie.

The Ducks, 21-17 overall, host Arizona in a Pac-10 Conference double header on April 14.
