




Oregon coach Buzz Summers said Rubin's effort was a good one, but that Uhlenkott just did what he had to for the win.

Rubin, Summers said, will continue to improve over the next few weeks as he battles back from illness that caused him to miss the team's trip to South Carolina.

'Ted's still trying to get back to where he was before he got sick." Summers said. "He's going to continue to get better as the season goes on.

Jon Weinberg, who lost to Rod Moreira, 6-2, 6-3, was playing at less than full strength because of an abdominal muscle injury that kept him out of last Thursday's match with Willamette


Oregon's only win of the
