**Forum to discuss lighting on campus**

Students who know of areas on campus that could use better lighting should attend a forum Wednesday in the EMU Gumwood Room from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Members of the campus lighting committee, as well as representatives from the Physical Plant and the Office of Public Safety, will answer questions and listen to students' concerns about walking on campus after dark.

"A plan (for lighting) exists, and there are steps going forward," said Kirk Bailey, ASUO University affairs coordinator and a member of the lighting committee. "We just need to talk again about locations."

The University is currently in Phase 2 of a three-phase plan to improve lighting. The

Physical Plant has already placed lights near Deady Hall and is ready to begin lighting the quad area north of the Knight Library, Bailey said.

The third phase of the plan targets areas south of the library and near the Bean Complex parking lot.

Bailey said he has already heard from architecture students who would like better lighting on the bridge leading to the studios north of Franklin Boulevard.

Anyone who has felt uncomfortable on campus after dark is invited to Wednesday's forum, Bailey said. Ideas for improving safety on campus aside from increasing lighting will also be discussed.

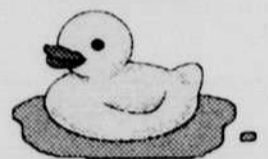
