New sororities rush to campus

Kappa Delta is one of two new sororities coming to the University in response to growing interest in the Greek system, said Deanna Jurgens, Pan-

hellenic president.

Registration for Kappa Delta begins today. By fall 1990, Sigma Kappa will also come to the University.

"It (the Greek system) was becoming more popular, more people were joining, and we didn't have the room to hold all the women who wanted to be in the sororities," Jurgens said.

"This is an excellent chance for people who missed the chance to get involved in the Greek system to get involved now," said Nicole Kiesz, expansion chair for Panhellenic.

Jurgens and Kiesz said the field consultants for Kappa Delta, who will be at rush registration, are looking for University students at all grade levels and not just freshmen and sophomores.

Kappa Delta will take residence at the old Alpha Omicron Phi house in fall 1990 after establishing itself as a "healthy" chapter, Kiesz said.

"A healthy colony means a sorority with a decent size membership that has the potential to survive on the campus," Kiesz said.

Jurgens explained that Panhellenic has set a ceiling of 90 women to start out a sorority.

"It's their opinion whether it's ... a healthy colony to move into a house or not," Kiesz said of the Kappa Delta national members and field consultants. Kiesz said Kappa Delta colonies have been successful in estab-

lishing sororities in the past at other colleges and universities and she believes Kappa Delta will also be successful here.

As expansion chair for Panhellenic last year, Jurgens began examining potential national sororities to come to the University to fulfill the growing demand for more chapters.

"We looked at what would be suitable for the campus," Jurgens said. "We looked at whether they had a house, how strong they were nationally, if there were alumni in the area, and how much, financially, they could put into a new sorority."

Kappa Delta and Sigma Kappa were chosen, Kiesz said. Sigma Kappa will take residence at the old Tau Kappa Epsilon fraternity after establishing itself as a healthy colony.

Kiesz said women who are interested in joining Kappa Delta need to register before rush. At rush, those who registered will meet Kappa Delta national members and members from Oregon State University.

Registration will be from April 5-19 in the EMU lobby from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Rush will be held April 20-22. Kappa Delta field consultants can be reached during registration at 343-4845.

"It's neat," Kiesz said, "because the girls in Kappa Delta are going to make their own traditions and decide what they want their sorority to be like."
