Students urged to vote for choice

New campus group builds foundation

Two local organizations are joining a nationwide movement to encourage students to support abortion-rights issues in this year's elections.

Students For Choice, a University student organization that encourages education on abortion issues, is joining the National Abortion Rights Action League to mobilize students.

To increase student participation in elections, the national NARAL office is sponsoring the Campus Organizing Project this week. The goal of the project is to transform pro-choice energy on campuses into political power.

Nationwide, many campuses are sponsoring rallies and voter registration drives in order to support pro-choice issues in the 1990 elections.

Genna Southworth, the regional coordinator of Eugene's NARAL office, said the drive in Eugene will be small because SFC is still establishing itself on campus. SFC has been operating since fall term.

"We're just getting started, and we're working to establish some groundwork," Southworth said.

"Currently, we're pushing for new members," she said.

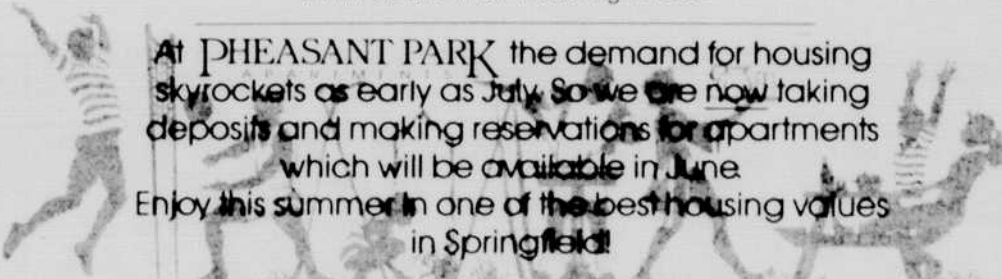
T.G.I.S... "Thank God it's spring!" However it is also a time when many of the students of the University of Oregon think about their housing needs.

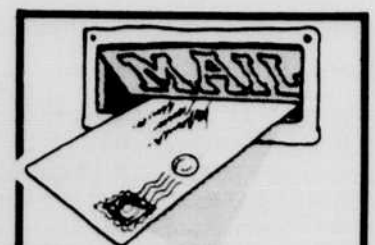
