

Birr explaining his side of the situation and requesting an explanation for the way police responded.

Wearstler filed a personal complaint on Monday against two officers.

As far as the partying is concerned, students say they won't be changing their habits but they won't be trying to instigate another uprising. "I don't think I was wrong in the first place, so I won't be changing much," said Hazen, who was also at last year's riot.

"I'm not going to be looking for trouble at parties," said Steve Buck, a resident of an apartment across the party site. "I'm not going to be going to parties in the next couple of weeks for fear of what might happen."

Camp agreed that parties

were going to continue but said that people might be considering the tear gas situation first before they have it.

"We don't really have parties like this, but we'll just keep it the way it was in the past," said Brad Wearstler, a resident of a neighboring building.

Students also expressed anger about the lack of support by the University and what they called biased coverage by the media.

It seems as though student concerns are being overlooked, Hazen said. He added the letter sent out by the ASUO last week advising students how to have a safe party didn't address student concerns and student rights.

Although students seem to be taking this issue seriously, others may be looking at the inci-

dent as a joke.

Two peculiar ads have been placed in the *Emerald* this week pertaining to the gas incident. In the April 3 issue, a classified ad in the personals section that read: "Be prepared to party — get your gas masks now — cheap! Dial 3-U STINK," seems to be downplaying the incident.

In the April 5 issue, an ad was placed by a student who is selling t-shirts reading "U of O spring '90 — It was a gas!" with a picture of a police officer and gas cans surrounding his feet.

Camp said the ads may be a response by students who feel this is the only way people are going to view the issue.

"Maybe they're saying maybe we can make it a joke if people aren't taking us seriously."

"... dues, contributions or gifts to GTF are not deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes," according to the American Federation of Teachers.

"Dues (fair share) paid to GTF, however, may qualify as business expenses, and may be deductible in limited circumstances subject to various restrictions imposed by the Internal Revenue Code," according to a memo from the GTF.

Buckles said he, along with the GTF and graduate school dean Ken Ramsing, have prepared a letter to the GTFs alerting them to the

difference between fair share fees and Oregon Fair Share.

The letter should be in GTF mailboxes by Monday, he said. "We want to get this thing cleared up as soon as possible."

GTFs who incorrectly filed their tax returns should file the one-page amended version, the 1040X, said Jim Mueller of Mueller and Yuva Certified Public Accountants.
