



## University. Nine measures up for vote

The following ballot measures have been referred to the student body by the ASUO Executive or by the Student Senate

• Student Health Insurance Students will be asked to choose one of four options: mandatory enrollment, a restrictive waiver for students with a plan comparable to that offered by ASUO, a loose waiver for students with any other policy or with adequate financial resources, voluntary enrollment.

• LTD Bus Service - Students will be asked if they want to continue to pay \$4.75 per term to pay for unlimited bus service in the Lane Transit District service area.

· Equal opportunity recruitment This measure would recommend that the University require any prospective employer to sign a statement certifying it does not discriminate in its hiring practices.

 Graduation pledge This measure would recommend that the University adopt a pledge signed by graduates stating they will investigate and consider the social and environmental consequences of any job opportunity

 Toxic substances This measure would recommend that the University prohibit any government or commercial activities that use or involve toxic substances from locating within 500 feet of the Willamette River on University-owned or University-managed property.


• Campus Radio - This measure asks students to provide \$25,000 in funding to start up a 24-hour radio station. KRMA would operate in conjunction with the other University-sponsored radio station, KWAX.

• Counseling Center Students would provide the Counseling Center with \$72,000 to pay for a full-time staff psychologist and more part-time counselors.

 OSPIRG The student-directed consumer interest group is asking students to re-affirm their support for the University chapter and also for an 11 percent increase in funding, bringing the total of incidental fee funding to \$112,000.

• EMU Child Care and Development Center - The center is asking for a \$42,000 increase in funding to pay for state-mandated wage increases.
