didn't come without cost though; Weigeldt suffered a hamstring cramp and couldn't compete in the 100 and 200-meter dashes.

Still, it was a big win as far as Dellinger was concerned.

"I was really pleased with the short relay," he said. "We had some good handoffs and ran well."

The biggest surprise of the meet undoubtedly came when Pedro daSilva, Brian Wright and Bob Gray went 1-2-3 respectively in the high hurdles.

"The high hurdles was an unexpected surprise and some bonus points for us," Dellinger said.

DaSilva clocked 14.28 while Wright set a PR in 14.32. The race was expected to be a battle between Gray and Washington State's Tony Li, fourth in last year's NCAA meet.

"It was just a match-up between their hurdler, Li, and Bob, where they were right next to each other and their arms were coming up and hitting each other," he said.

"They probably shouldn't have been next to each other and that allowed the other two guys to go by."

The Ducks had several other big-time performances that were also crucial in beating Washington State.

• Hammer thrower Scott McGee, the Pac-10's top thrower, came within four inches of his PR with a best of 220-2.

• Senior Jimmy Howarth, a forgotten man for Oregon, finished third in the 1,500 and

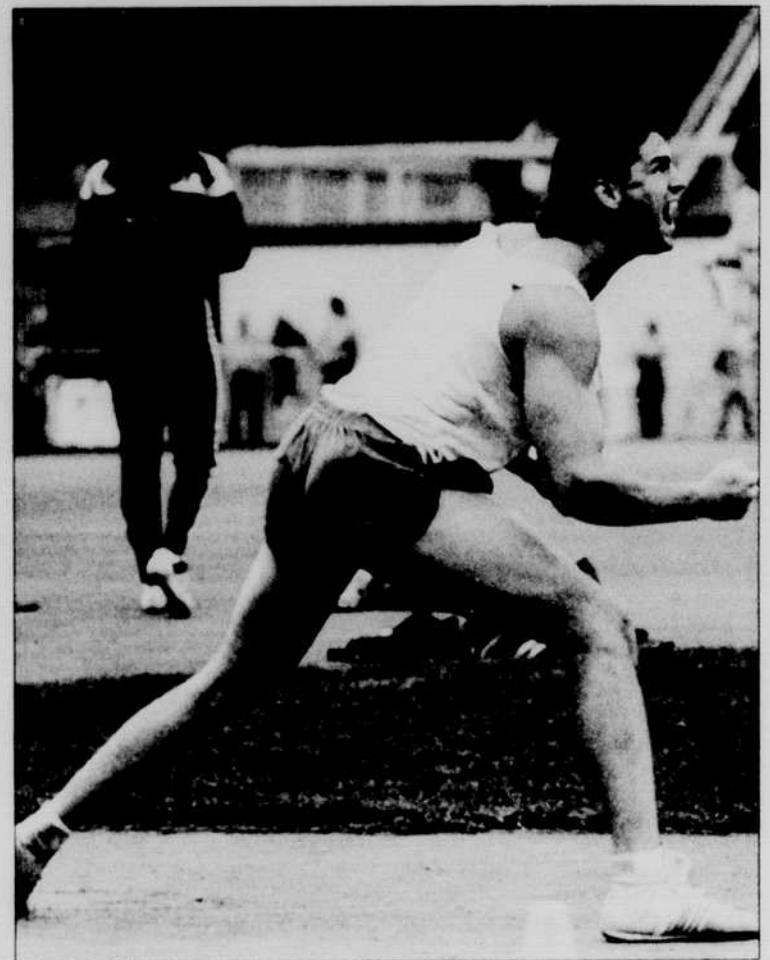

then doubled back to win the 800 meters in 1:51.41.
